

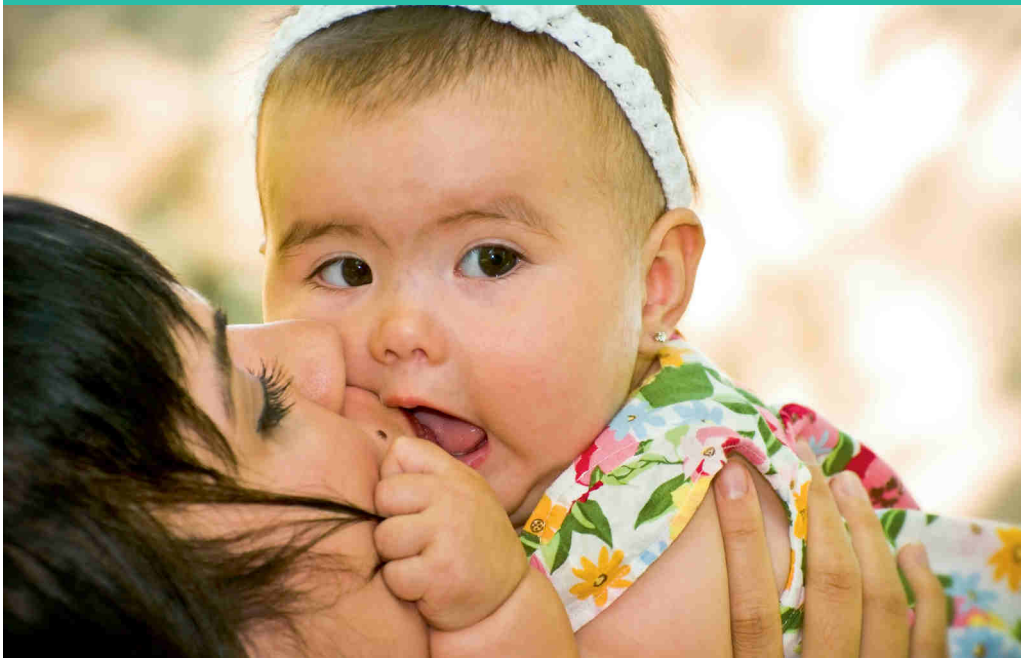

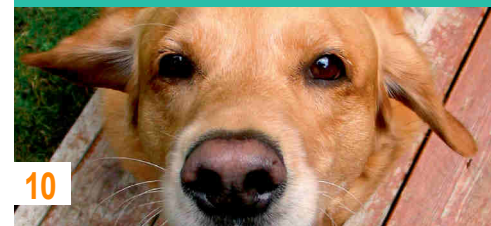

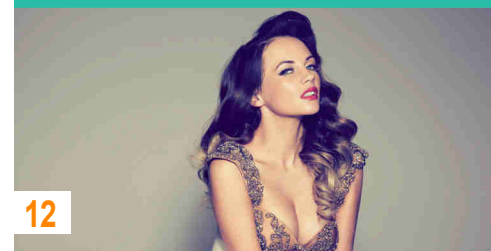

The New Year is well and truly underway with children returning to school, the holiday period generally coming to an end and activity resuming in our construction and building industry as the growth across Cockburn continues unabated in our residential, commercial, retail and industry sectors.

The City's Integrated Health and Community Facility, including the GP Super Clinic and Library at Success, is planned to open towards the middle of the year. This will see another state-of-the-art and iconic building near the eastern gateway to our City providing a range of services for the benefit of our community. The expansion of the nearby Cockburn Gateway Shopping City, the associated road upgrades around this precinct, including the addition of traffic lights at the Beeliam Road and Wentworth Parade intersection will assist in the safer movement of traffic.

Planning continues for the Cockburn Central West Regional Physical Activity and Education Centre and apartment-style living complexes continue to emerge within the adjacent Cockburn Central Town Centre with a diverse mix of new cafes and restaurants offering a cosmopolitan mix of cuisines. The Phoenix Central and Hamilton Hill Revitalisation strategies are underway with Coolbellup to follow. In fact, almost anywhere you go across our great City, improvements are being made to ensure the best available services and opportunities are delivered to our community.

The annual Carnival of Events is just unfolding with concerts, the Cockburn Idol competition, Coogee Beach Festival and the Harvest Hoo Ha coming your way as free family events. The City's 2014 wall calendar has pages packed with information on these events.

With all the great things happening across our City we also need to be aware of the biggest challenge facing our community: local government reform. While Cockburn has been a strong advocate for reform, the State Government's announcement on 12 November 2013 effectively 'carving up' our City has seen, and will continue to see, an outpouring of emotion and community outrage. The City will be working to ensure that the outcomes of the process going forward are based on communities of interest, deliberations that are transparent, open and accountable and result in the retention of Cockburn as a vibrant and progressive local government.

On behalf of the elected members and staff I trust that 2014 brings everyone the opportunity to enhance their personal and family well-being. I look forward to the input of our valued volunteers and the community as we continue to showcase all that Cockburn has to offer.

Meet the Facilities' Team

The City's Facilities' team is responsible for maintenance, repairs and renovations to existing community, civic and recreational buildings within Cockburn.

The five-man team together manage the day-to-day operation of 126 buildings, ensuring upkeep such as

plumbing, electrical, graffiti and carpentry and even assisted with removing ship wrecks at our local CY O'Connor Beach.

In the last year the team has responded to 1,647 customer requests just within building facilities. They strive to remain customer-focused and maintain a great level of service to our community and its facilities.

Services for the frail, aged and people with disability

The City of Cockburn provides over 533 clients with 11 different service types of Home and Community Care (HACC) or Community Aged Care Packages. This broad range of services assists eligible people to maintain their independence. The City of Fremantle previously operated a wide range of these services but has now stopped directly providing most of these services to the community and offer only two service types. The cities of Melville and Kwinana previously operated some HACC services but have now stopped directly providing these services. The City of Cockburn is the only local government in the area to provide Community Aged Care Packages.



Services for the Indigenous population

The City of Cockburn is the only local government in the south metropolitan area to directly provide an Aboriginal Adult Day Centre for Aboriginal people who are frail, aged or have a disability. The City also provides all HACC service types and specific Aboriginal Community Aged Care Packages to assist Aboriginal people to maintain their independence.



Services for young people

The City of Cockburn and City of Kwinana are the only local governments in the area to directly provide dedicated Youth Centres that offer a broad range of recreation, educational and arts activities for young people six days per week during school terms.



The City of Cockburn is the only local government to directly provide individual counselling services for “at risk” young people. Cockburn is the only local government in the area to provide a free mobile outdoor youth recreation service.

Caring for our environment

The City currently provides funding for the Cockburn Wetlands Education Centre and Native ARC to monitor and enhance the local bushland and wetlands.



Community Programs and Services

The City of Cockburn has a Policy which provides for a free events program (worth \$500,000 per year) enjoyed by residents and visitors alike. The City also provides \$1 million every year in grants and donations back to the community. None of the other Councils in the region provide this sum as contributions to their communities.



The National Broadband Network (NBN) is an upgrade to Australia's existing telecommunications network. It's designed to provide all Australians with access to fast, affordable and reliable internet and phone services. The Government has a clear policy for a faster, more affordable rollout of the NBN. In order to deliver this policy, a series of reviews is underway and NBN Co, is in a period of transition. This transition will last for several months as the commercial, financial, legislative, and regulatory issues of the program are clarified. During this period NBN Co will also address a number of operational changes that are needed to move to the new policy, and will conduct the necessary technical trials.

What has happened to the sites that have been removed from the website?

Sites that have been removed temporarily from NBN Co maps are being reviewed in line with the new rollout priorities. NBN Co has been given set goals during the transition period, including to avoid service disruption for consumers and to minimise the impact on industry and employment, in order to achieve the less costly and speedier rollout objective as seamlessly as possible.

NBN Co expects to add further locations to the rollout as the review is progressed.

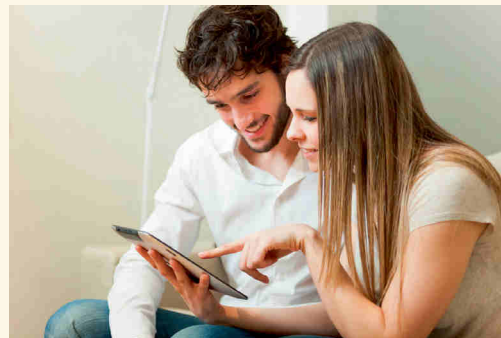
Which homes will continue to receive FTTP?

Currently the government's instructions are that new developments that meet certain criteria will continue to receive FTTP as before.

In regard to the rollout in brownfields areas, the Shareholder Ministers have said that:

- For 300,000 premises "where build instructions have been issued to delivery partners", existing construction should continue. An additional 150,000 premises have since been approved to go ahead to the "build commenced" milestone to ensure a steady flow of work;
- Decisions about the technology to be used in other areas will be influenced by the outcome of the Strategic Review and other analyses underway.

WASTE BINS CAN BLOCK FOOTPATHS



- Do you have a footpath in front of your house?
- Is your footpath placed next to the road kerb?
- Is your footpath one metre wide or less?

If the answer is "yes" to these three questions, then this information is for you.

The two-metre wide path on major roads **does** allow space for bins to be presented at the kerb.

The one-metre wide path on minor roads **does not** allow space for bins to be presented at the kerb.

If you have a one-metre wide footpath or smaller, please try to place your bin as close to the path as possible, but not on the footpath. Also it's a good idea to place your bins a minimum of 300mm apart so they can be emptied.

This will leave the entire footpath width free for users. When servicing your bin, we will return your bin to that same location. This practice will help to improve the safety and access for footpath users.

Please think about school children and motorised wheelchair users if they are in your area.

The City of Cockburn received the *2013 Best in WA Award* at the Children's Environment and Health Local Government Report Card Project 2013.

The project is run by the Public Health Advocacy Institute of WA, Healthway and the WA Local Government Association (WALGA).

Mayor Logan Howlett said the City provides services that are second-to-none including more than seven free annual events aimed at children and families.

"Excellent services, brilliant infrastructure and creative and passionate staff have shown Cockburn to be a hallmark of success time and time again," he said.

Cockburn was runner up in the awards previously in 2011 and 2012.

"When we thought about how to approach building a child-friendly city, we asked the experts, we asked the kids," said Mayor Howlett.

"The City is one of only a few local governments to have a Children's Reference Group and we consult with them at every turn to ensure that every investment we make in children's services and facilities is suitable for their needs and for the needs of our community," he said.

The City of Cockburn provides many children's services:

- Family Day Care and In Home Child Care;
- 14 free groups for parents and young children each week;
- More than seven free annual community events aimed at children and families; and,
- The unique provision of free Early Years home visiting and parenting services for families and two free Family Support Services.

The City of Cockburn also won four categories in Child Care Centre Design and Placement, Smoke Free Environments, Prevention of Disease, and Child Health and Development.

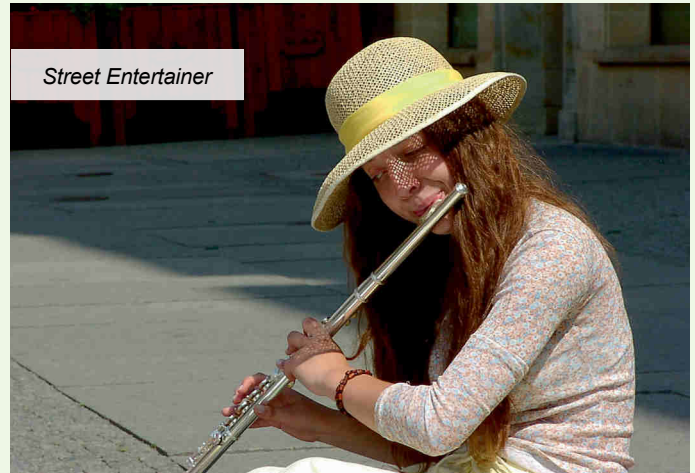

IS YOUR DOG TOO VOCAL?



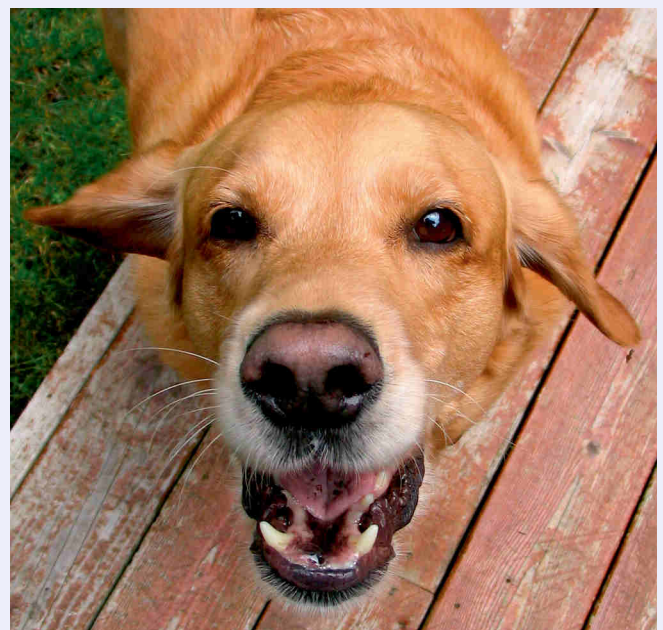
Sometimes our canine companions can be a little vocal, particularly when we're not home, therefore it's important to be mindful of our neighbours.

Some typical reasons for dogs barking can include boredom, separation anxiety from their owner, fear (they may be afraid of people coming to the door), territorial behaviour (e.g. barks at your neighbour over the fence and attention-seeking.)

The RSPCA website www.kb.rspca.org.au suggests that to help stop the excessive barking you need to find out what's causing your dog to bark in the first place. Once you know what the problem is, there are some techniques you can put in place to help control the barking and maintain a good relationship with your neighbours. These techniques are available on this website.

If you are on the receiving end and your neighbour's dog is excessively barking, you can visit the City's website www.cockburn.wa.gov.au/dogs and click on the link 'barking dogs' to download a 'Dog Barking Information Pack'. This pack is aimed at trying to

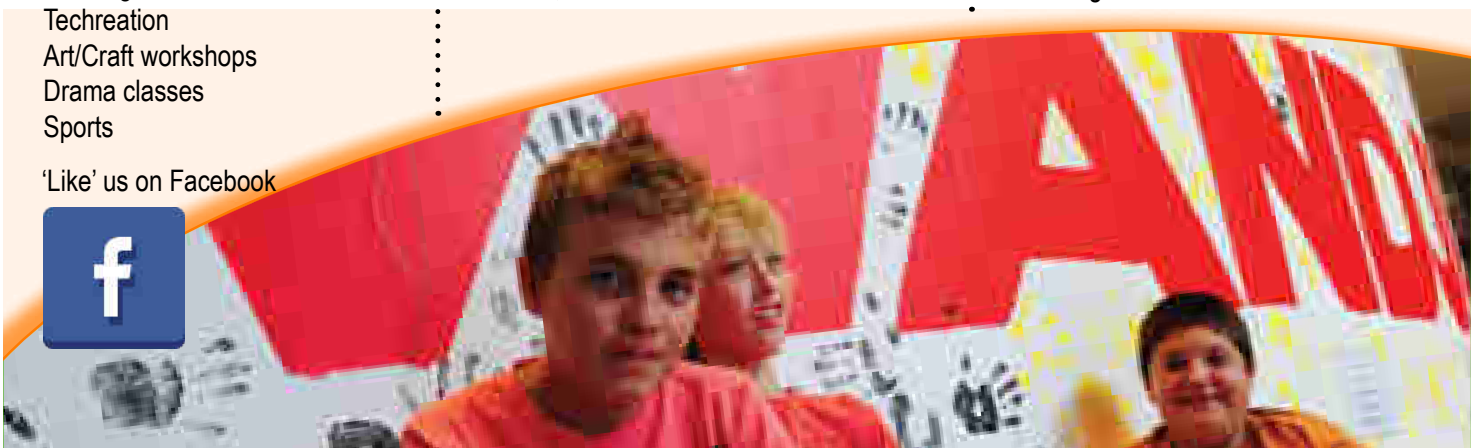

GRANTS, DONATIONS AND SPONSORSHIP FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES



APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN

Applications are now open for the following funding opportunities to support local groups, organisations and individuals for a wide variety of activities and services.

Community Grants assist local community groups and organisations to provide projects or activities that benefit residents of Cockburn. Applications are to a maximum of \$15,000, with smaller amounts encouraged.

Sustainable Events Grants assist local community groups and organisations in the provision of ongoing programs and activities for the benefit of the residents of Cockburn. The maximum grant provided to any one group will be \$7,000, over a four-year period.

Donations are available to provide financial assistance towards the day-to-day running costs of not-for-profit groups, not for a specific project or activity. Donations are limited and highly competitive.

Sponsorship is a mutually beneficial partnership arrangement where the City of Cockburn makes a financial contribution to a group or organisation or individual* for a specific purpose, project, activity or event and, in return, the City receives public recognition for its contribution. The maximum is \$20,000 for organisations and \$2,000 for individuals.

** Individual Sponsorship applications are invited year round. Please note, applications must be submitted at least two months before you require a decision from the City of Cockburn.*

Cultural Grants support local arts and cultural activities. Applications are to a maximum of \$4,000, with smaller amounts encouraged.

TOP HONOURS FOR COCKBURN CENTRAL TOWN CENTRE PLANNING



The planning behind Cockburn Central Town Centre could influence the future development of urban centres across Perth, following the project's success at the 2013 Western Australian Awards for Planning Excellence.

The Awards, judged by the Planning Institute of Australia's (PIA) WA division, recognised LandCorp and its partners Cardno and Urbis for planning a flexible and adaptive community.

LandCorp chief executive officer Ross Holt said the project was aided by a clear vision to create a modern destination, not just a thoroughfare for the 5,500 commuters who use the bus and train interchange daily.

"Delivering an Activity Centre like this is not just about the buildings and transport routes. We are

creating a place that draws people in, a place where people want to live, work and play; a place that meets the needs of its people today and into the future," Mr Holt said.

Lorraine Elliott, Principal Planner at Cardno, said that with a collaborative approach, Cockburn Central Town Centre has achieved its objective; a modern destination and a vibrant community.



As the State winner in its category, Cockburn Central Town Centre will be judged among other state and territory winners in the 2014 National Awards for Planning Excellence in March.



2013 was a busy year for approvals related to the former Banjup quarry site. The City conducted public consultation over a long period of time. In January, the site was rezoned for 'Urban' purposes by the State Government. This means that the site is now able to be developed for residential purposes. The City followed suit with the State Government's rezoning to enable a prosperous community to be built in this area.

The majority of the submissions received by the City's public consultation process were positive and supportive of the development. Stockland submitted a structure plan to show how the 144

hectare former quarry site could be developed for residential development.

The key components for the Stockland development (currently being marketed with the estate name: 'Calleya') are:

- 1800 dwellings
- 1 primary school
- Small Neighbourhood Centre (2800 square metre net lettable area)
- Sports Oval/Clubrooms
- Community Centre

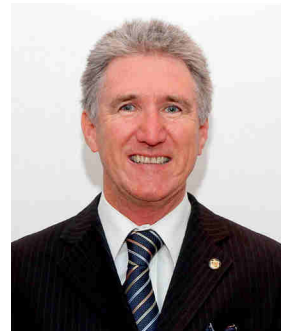
