APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN

Applications are now open for the following funding opportunities to support local groups, organisations and individuals for a wide variety of activities and services:

Community Grants assist local community groups and organisations to provide projects or activities that benefit residents of Cockburn. Applications are to a maximum of \$15,000, with smaller amounts encouraged.

Sustainable Events Grants assist local community groups and organisations in the provision of ongoing programs and activities. The maximum grant provided to any one group will be \$7,000, over a four-year period.

Donations are available to provide financial assistance towards the day-to-day running costs of not-for-profit groups, not for a specific project or activity. Donations are limited and highly competitive.

Sponsorship is a mutually beneficial partnership arrangement where the City of Cockburn makes a financial contribution to a group, organisation or individual for a specific purpose, project, activity or event and, in return, the City receives public recognition for its contribution. The maximum is \$20,000 for organisations and \$2,000 for individuals.

Cultural Grants support local arts and cultural activities. Applications to a maximum of \$4,000, with smaller amounts encouraged.

Co-health - Beating poor health



2012 National Year of Reading



14 February 2012, Library Lover's Day, marks a special occasion not only for Cockburn Libraries but all libraries throughout Australia. It is the launch of 2012 National Year of Reading. This year is a time to celebrate the joys of reading and to showcase all the programs that libraries provide to encourage reading and literacy.

It is awful realisation that nearly half the population of adult Australians have poor functional literacy skills. To remedy these statistics libraries are actively trying to engage and assist readers.

Did you know that your local libraries provide a home library service, book clubs, writing groups, a dead poets' society and crime club where reading is an essential component? Every year we have local authors visit the library and introduce themselves as well as their books, sometimes over a glass of wine and cheese. We also run Reading Aloud sessions at Spearwood Library for people with disabilities from South Metropolitan Personnel and for residents at Carrington Nursing Home. And we provide English conversation sessions, with assistance from Read Write Now and volunteers, for migrants to improve their spoken English and comprehension.

We hope that in 2012 all Cockburn residents will support their libraries' programs and will discover and rediscover the magic of books and reading so Australia can become a great nation of readers.

Paul De-Bruin

Youth Centre Coordinator

Paul is responsible for coordinating and promoting the activities provided at the Cockburn Youth Centre in Success. Since Paul has been the Coordinator, the number of Youth Centre contacts has doubled from 1000 per month to more than 2000 contacts per month. Paul has excellent customer service skills and is very good at working with young people, their parents and other relevant organisations. Paul regularly receives positive feedback from parents, young people and service providers about his positive attitude, people skills and his excellent management of the Youth Centre. Paul is excellent at working with a diverse range of young people from different cultural backgrounds, ages, people with disabilities and 'at risk' youth. Paul has previously been responsible for implementing changes in the Youth Outrage holiday program, which enabled the City to win a State Disability Services Commission Award.

Paul Gabbert

Disability Access and Inclusion Officer 2011 (recently moved to Seniors Centre Coordinator position in August 2011)

Paul worked collaboratively with the City's Disability Reference Group and City of Cockburn staff to achieve some excellent outcomes for people with disabilities living in Cockburn through the implementation of the City's Disability Access and Inclusion Plan. He was integral in delivering Disability Access and Inclusion Training to all staff to build awareness about people with disabilities.

As part of his role Paul was also required to undertake home visits in conjunction with Environmental Health Officers to uninhabitable properties due to hoarding, disrepair or rubbish. Paul would work sensitively with the occupant and any family members to ensure that the property was brought back to the required minimum health standards. This was a very difficult task and Paul did it with great skill, care and compassion.

He also worked at the Strategic level on many projects such as Disability Access requirements at the Port Coogee Development, and he also formed a South Western Metropolitan Hoarding Working Party to address the international issue of hoarding and people living in domestic squalor.

Port Coogee



- Three residential developments have been completed in the Cockburn Central Town Centre (providing 123 dwellings on Lots 3, 9 and 12 completed by Australand)
- Stage 1 of Plaza 817 on Lot 17 (corner Beeliar Drive and North Lake Road) has been completed and provides a range of offices, retail and consulting rooms. Stage two of Plaza 817 is under construction and will consist of a number of retail tenancies including several for food and beverage.
- Lot 4 adjacent to the train station includes a mixed-use building including 81 residential apartments and 13 retail tenancies on the ground floor level and is currently being developed.
- Lot 8 adjacent to North Lake Road consists of a further 47 apartments as the first stage of a total development comprising of 194 apartments. An application has been lodged for stage 2 consisting of 44 residential apartments.
- The Cockburn Emergency Services Headquarters is currently being developed.
- Lot 10 will provide an additional 130 residential apartments and a small area of commercial and retail space opposite the Town Square is currently being developed.

Bus It for FREE

City of Cockburn's Youth Services has answered the call by maintaining a free bus service to young people in Cockburn after the YMCA Mobile bus service had to cease operation.

The idea came about in response to numerous community requests from young people, families, church groups, local business and schools seeking free, supervised activities targeting young people 10 to 17 years.

This service will start in Term 1 from 3.30pm-6.30pm;

Mondays – Len Packham Reserve, Cordelia Ave, Coolbellup

Tuesdays – Southwell Park, Southwell Crescent,

Wednesdays – Beeliam Reserve, Lakefront Avenue, Beeliam

In addition, the service will provide required information and referral to support services for young people and their families.

The five key objectives for this service are:

- To provide social and recreational activities in the Cockburn area;
- To provide a positive adult role model to help build resilience and capacity in young people;
- To develop and improve skills of young people either for education, employment, social inclusion and health;
- To encourage participation in health and sustainable relationships between young people and the community; and
- To be a point of referral to other support services for young people




Each edition we will feature the meaning of a different Cockburn suburb.

The meaning of Banjup


Banjup is a charming, semi-rural area of the City of Cockburn that runs off Armadale Road.

The actual meaning of the name 'Banjup' is unknown. However, in 1889, surveyor James Oxley recorded the name of Lake Bangup and this was shown on regional maps. Land in the area was resumed in 1907 for the Armadale-Jandakot Railway link and a station was constructed 3.6km north of Bangup Lake, named Banjupp. This was considered to be a correction to the original name and was used until the mid 1930s when it was changed to Banjup.

One of the places of historic interest in this area is the Banjup Memorial Park. Established shortly after World War I, individual trees were planted in memory of the 14 Banjup men, including three sets of brothers, who served in the war. Six of the men were killed, four wounded and four returned home. Sadly, Banjup holds a record in the state for having the highest proportion of casualties compared to population.

To ensure that we capture the issues that are important to the community, we will be holding a series of community conversations in March to enable you to have input into the plan.



Traffic lights to improve safety

Australand will be installing a new set of traffic signals on Cockburn Road, at Orsino Boulevard, a condition of their development approval for Port Coogee.

Main Roads WA has just approved the traffic signal design so Australand now need to engage a contractor. Installation of the signals is anticipated to occur in February-March 2012.

The signals are being installed to enable safer access to and from the development site, particularly for right-turning traffic such as buses that will service the subdivision and once the marina is built, vehicles towing boats. Traffic lights will also incorporate pedestrian signals.
