COCKBURN GETS \$10M THUMB'S UP FROM STATE GOVERNMENT

The WA Government announced \$10 million (M) funding for the City of Cockburn Regional Aquatic Sports Facility at Cockburn Central West in May. This brings external funding to a total of \$22.4M, 21% of the total \$106M.

This landmark community sporting facility project is the largest of its kind ever undertaken in WA by a local government authority. It will be a fantastic facility for Cockburn residents and our great sporting clubs. The facility will include three swimming pools and water slides.

Previously announced funding includes \$10M in Regional Development funding from the Federal Government and the \$2.4M Community Sport and Recreation Facility Grant from the State Government.

This community complex will also become the new home for the Fremantle Dockers, providing training and administration facilities. This will also include a retail shop, community meeting spaces and an AFL-standard oval. Curtin University students will also use the facilities for learning on-site. Fremantle Football Club and Curtin University are responsible for the costs of their own facilities, but working in partnership has enabled such a state-of-the-art facility to be developed.

Announcements on local government reform in the Perth metropolitan area are due to be made by the Minister for Local Government & Communities in July. This follows the Local Government Advisory Board's (LGAB) review of the proposals

and submissions received and their report and accompanying recommendations to the Minister on the new local government boundaries.

The options open to the Minister are to either accept or reject the LGAB's recommendations; they cannot be modified. If the Minister accepts the LGAB's recommendations then in due course the Governor's Orders will be sought to create the new local governments effective from 1 July 2015.

At this point in time, the Minister has identified the City of Cockburn along with 13 other local governments to be abolished. In our case, the City of Kwinana would govern the City for the period 1 July to 17 October 2015 at which time local government elections for the 'new' council would be conducted. This outcome has been brought about by the Barnett Government's decision to propose Boundary Changes instead of Amalgamations thereby removing affected communities from having a say in their future. This

amounts to 'forced change' directly contrary to the Barnett's position going to the 2013 State election.

I urge residents of Cockburn to continue to engage with Members of Parliament on the State Government's proposal to 'carve up' the City of Cockburn. Your views need to be heard. We are at a critical juncture in our City's future and it is people power that can make the difference.

The 'carving up' of sustainable local governments such as Cockburn is unheard of in local government reform in Australia. The City has been an advocate for local government reform and there has been no reason provided by the Government to the Council or its community on the reason(s) for their action. The 2012 Robson Report commissioned by the Government recommended that Cockburn be one of 12 (down from 30) local governments to make up the Perth metropolitan area going forward. In July 2013 the Government announced the amalgamation of Cockburn and Kwinana. In 2014 the Government announced the proposed abolition of Cockburn – no rhyme, no reason, no justification.

An 'Affordable Housing Toolkit' that brings together information for buyers, tenants and developers is now online!

The project was put together by members from housing associations, Department of Planning, Department of Housing, LandCorp and the City of Cockburn.

The initiative is a simple idea to put all information about affordable housing in one place to create a one-stop-shop.

The toolkit includes:

- Incentives available to potential developers of Cockburn Coast including what partnerships are available.
- Assistance available for purchasers and renters such as Keystart Home Loans and the National Rental Affordability Scheme.

- Examples of what affordable housing looks like to encourage the growth of the market and increase availability for the public.

WAYFINDING SIGNS INSTALLED ON A CORNER NEAR YOU!



Australia's biggest ever Wayfinding Project is now underway in Cockburn with 524 non-slip pavement adhesive 'wayfinders' that have been installed around the City. These signs will assist residents to become more connected with their local community and to increase physical activity.

The program is part of the Your Move program, a partnership project with the State Government.

The signs point out how to make the most of the City. There are 396 'Walk this Way' signs pointing out destinations including shops, libraries, parks and sporting ovals.

If you're on two wheels you'll benefit from 112 'Share the Path' safety signs to remind cyclists and walkers to look out for each other as well as cars.

There are signs pointing out new and existing bike racks across the City so you can secure your bike at key locations.

WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY CELEBRATES BIBRA LAKE



This month marks the United Nation's World Environment Day that was celebrated internationally on 5 June. The day is a timely reminder to care for our City's most valuable environmental asset, Bibra Lake.

We are lucky to have some of Western Australia's best inland lakes which form two unique chains of wetlands running from north to south through the heart of our City.

Bibra Lake is part of the Beeliar Regional Park. The lake supports a range of threatened species such as the Carnaby's Black Cockatoos and Rainbow Bee eaters.

The Beeliar Regional Park contains the Banksia Woodlands that are a 'Priority Ecological Community'. The Wetlands are listed as a Bush Forever site meaning the protection of the wetlands is highly important.

The City's CoSafe security service offers a 24/7 security surveillance to its residents 365 days a year.

CoSafe also works closely with the WA Police to address local issues and share intelligence to assist in the apprehension of persons of interest.

The City has a well-established Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the WA Police Service and both services work together to improve community safety and security for the City's 21 suburbs.

Members of the CoSafe's service also works closely with Neighbourhood Watch, the City's Cockburn Community Interagency Crime Prevention Group and attends juvenile justice meetings as required.

Latest figures show that for the period 1 July 2013 to 27 February 2014 the City's CoSafe has attended to over 45,000 jobs and has answered 4,461 calls just showing how integral CoSafe has now become to the City's community. A majority of call-outs relate to anti-social behaviour, noise complaints and suspicious activity.

COCKBURN CENTRAL TRAFFIC CONGESTION

The Public Transport Authority (State Government) provides most of the all-day car parking off Knock Place, Jandakot. The car park on the east side of the Kwinana Freeway for the Cockburn Central Train Station can accommodate 880 vehicles.

In 2012 the State Government increased the number of parking bays from 410 to 880 with a view to improve parking but without the necessary improvements to the adjacent road network, which has led to an increase in traffic congestion.

The City requested better traffic management solutions to be in place before the car park opened. This advice was not followed by the Western Australian Planning Commission who approved the additional bays.

The only vehicle access to Knock Place is via Solomon Road at an intersection which is only 40 meters away from the busy Armadale Road/Solomon Road intersection.

A common complaint about the delays being experienced by commuters is that the 18-minute rail journey from Perth to Cockburn Central is quicker than the time it takes to exit the car park.

There are a range of solutions including installing traffic lights at the intersection of Armadale and Solomon road, but this was not supported by Main Roads WA.

The long term solution is to construct a bridge to extend North Lake Road across the Freeway, see No.1 on the map. To find out more about what you can do to lobby the State Government to build the bridge visit:

RECENTLY COMPLETED AND UPCOMING ROADWORKS

01. Cockburn Central traffic solution is the North Lake Road Bridge

Modelling clearly shows that a new bridge at North Lake Road will address traffic congestion at Cockburn Central.

The City continues to lobby the State Government to build the North Lake Road Bridge linking North Lake Road to Armadale Road. The City has committed \$10 million to facilitate the road connections to the bridge.

02. Bibra Drive / North Lake Road

The City acknowledges that the number of crashes at this intersection qualifies it as a Black Spot. Main Roads WA rejected the City's application to improve this intersection in 2010. The City has since applied for Black Spot Program funding to modify the intersection. If approved, construction will occur in 2014-15.

03. Hammond Road, from Bartram Road to Russell Road

COMPLETED

The widening of Hammond Road from Bartram Road to Russell Road. This widening provides additional road capacity to accommodate traffic growth.

04. Widening of Beelias Drive (Wentworth Parade to the Kwinana Freeway)

COMPLETED

This section of Beelias Drive has been widened from four-lanes to six-lanes. This provides additional road capacity to help reduce congestion along busy Beelias Drive. This project is a condition of approval for the extension of Cockburn Gateway Shopping City.

05. North Lake Road duplication between Hammond Road and Kentucky Court

This section of the road will be widened to a dual carriage way with anticipated completion at the end of 2015. The rapid development of Beelias, Cockburn Central, Hammond Park, Success and Aubin Grove have led to increased traffic.


Construction on this project began in April.

06. Beelias Drive Underpass

A new bus-only road and pedestrian access between the Cockburn Central Town Centre and the shopping centre will be constructed through the underpass by Landcorp next to the Kwinana Freeway in 2014. The underpass will provide an efficient north-south link for buses that will help reduce delays to bus services in the area due to traffic congestion. The underpass will also provide safer and quicker access for pedestrians.

07. Beeliar Drive / Hammond Road Intersection

This Black Spot funded project will realign the northern leg of Hammond Road at Beeliar Drive. The City will also install four-way traffic lights at this intersection. The intersection will be safer for motorists particularly travelling along Hammond Road who find it difficult to turn onto Beeliar Drive due to the continuous flow of traffic. The project is currently under way and expected to be completed this month.

08. North Lake Road realignment (Midgegooroo Avenue)

COMPLETED

North Lake Road was realigned adjacent to the Cockburn Central Town Centre by Landcorp. This involved the creation of a four-way traffic light controlled intersection at Kentucky Drive. The section of North Lake Road between the new intersection at Kentucky Drive and Beeliar Drive has been renamed 'Midgegooroo Avenue'.

City's Mechanics

The City has more than 330 mechanical assets which need ongoing maintenance by the team at the depot workshop. The five-person team includes a recently graduated and a second-year Apprentice. They provide a challenging seven day a week on-call service necessary for critical equipment such as our waste trucks that operate on public holidays, heavy plant located at the Henderson Waste Recovery Park and general day-to-day upkeep of machinery throughout the organisation.

When conducting and servicing such heavy equipment including trucks, excavators, loaders and dozens of other

high-risk mechanical equipment, nothing can be left to chance. The workshop team have managed to achieve a remarkable result of no 'Lost Time Injuries' over an eight-year period by practicing a safe work environment and remaining alert at all times.

HISTORY WITH LEAH - SPEARWOOD RAILWAY STATION



Leah from Spearwood Library

The Spearwood Railway Station is a distant Cockburn memory. In 1905 Jandakot farmers won their battle to have the railway line extended out from Fremantle. Work was finished in 1906, with Spearwood station located where the train line intersected Rockingham Road.

By 1909 the station was in regular use by Cockburn residents, and some of the small wooden buildings at the Jandakot station were moved to be rebuilt on

the platform at Spearwood. Trains ran once a day in each direction.

The line was closed to passengers in the 1950s, but the nearby Watsonia factory could occasionally persuade the railway service to add an extra passenger carriage for special events. One Cockburn resident remembers catching the train from Spearwood to the Royal Show in the 1960s with all the factory workers and their families.

That line is now the Fremantle-Forrestfield freight line, and all that is left of the Spearwood Station are a few wooden posts stuck in the dirt.

That Council place on its 2014-2015 budget for consideration the sum of \$200,000 for the demolition of the Joe Cooper Recreation Centre and for the cost of a memorial plaque to be located on the site.

In December 2013 the City received a Building Condition and Construction Code Compliance Report, which recommended that due to its very poor condition the City should not continue to utilise the building.

Given its poor condition, the City believes there would be no community benefit in spending ratepayer funds on expensive refurbishment works. An upgrade is planned at the Beale Park facilities in Spearwood to create a quality regional facility that is well located.

Progressing towards a new Cockburn-Kwinana Local Government



The State Government has called on Local Governments to form committees to undertake the preliminary planning for amalgamation of new local governments. These committees are called the 'Local Implementation Committees' (LIC).

The City of Cockburn recently formed the Cockburn-Kwinana LIC. It will meet monthly to discuss and progress issues pertaining to the establishment of a new City of Cockburn-Kwinana (encompassing the current districts of Cockburn and Kwinana).

The LIC's tasks include all that is necessary to ensure that the new local government can function as of 1 July 2015. For example, the LIC will discuss the new organisation structure; which services fall under which departments; the practical aspects of locating and accommodating the new local government and most importantly, how to continue to provide better services to residents.

The Committee comprises of representatives each from the City of Cockburn, the Cockburn-Kwinana Community Steering Group Committee and the Kwinana Community. The City of Kwinana has been invited to be a member of the LIC.

Final decisions on the Local Government Reform process are not expected to be known until July 2014. While there are many proposals that the Local Government Advisory Board (the Board) is weighing up as part of its analysis, the key task will be for local governments to be ready to implement their proposals. The City of Cockburn put forward a proposal to unite the whole of the communities of Cockburn and Kwinana, which is what the LIC are focussing on.

PENSIONERS AND SENIORS RATES



Registered concession holders who have not yet paid their council rates are encouraged to do so by 15 June 2014, so the rebate can be claimed on their behalf from the Office of State Revenue.

Courtesy letters were issued to all registered concession holders in May advising of the remaining balance payable in order for the rebate to be claimed.

For example, notification is required when;

- Your original application details have changed
- You or your spouse ceases occupation of the property
- As a WA Seniors card holder you become an eligible pensioner or the holder of a Commonwealth Seniors Health Card.

During 2013 a small, yet devoted number of volunteers from the Harvest Lakes Residents Association (HLRA) sub-committee participated in a clean-up and planting project that saw Harmony Lake thrive during both the winter and summer months.
