Strong Community input into Cockburn Central planning

The Cockburn community has enthusiastically embraced the opportunity to have its say in the planning of the area's new regional town centre, with the working title Cockburn Central.

With the first phase of community consultation complete, the Cockburn Central Project Team, led by project manager LandCorp, has reported strong feedback that has been largely positive and constructive.

"We are very pleased with the initial round of consultation," Cockburn Central Project Steering Committee chair, Garry McKeown of the Department for Planning and Infrastructure, said.

"A lot of useful information has been obtained on what should be included in a regional town centre."

Cockburn Central will be sited on 42 hectares next to the Beeliar Drive-Kwinana Freeway interchange and will provide a new community focus for the Cockburn region.

It will eventually cater for a catchment population forecast to reach about 200,000 and will include a major public transit station comprising buses and the new South-West rail link.

In addition to transport, retail, commercial, residential and community facilities, more than 50 per cent of the

project area is earmarked for bushland, open space, recreation and enhanced wetlands.

Community involvement at the planning stage is seen as vital to the creation of a town centre that works and is supported by the people of Cockburn.

Consultation involved a broad crosssection from individual members of the public to environmental and community groups together with business and local and state government representatives.

Topics discussed include community facilities, cultural considerations, safety and security, the environment,

planning and infrastructure and transport.

In the past month, the community has jumped at the chance to ask questions and provide feedback through open days at Gateways Shopping Centre, via the mail and a telephone Info Line. Working parties have also met.

These initiatives were supported by an extensive awareness campaign comprising newsletters, local newspaper advertisements and information sheets.

The Cockburn Central Project Team has developed a draft structure plan that includes community ideas and feedback for the proposed regional centre.

That draft plan was submitted to Cockburn Council in November for approval to advertise it for further community comment.

Once further feedback on the draft is received, a final plan will then be put to Council for approval.

Cockburn Central is being progressed by the Department for Planning and Infrastructure, City of Cockburn and LandCorp in partnership with the local community.

Cockburn Youth Finish in Rally Oz

One thousand four hundred and three torturous kilometres of notoriously loose and dangerous WA roads, conditions varying from cold, windy, rainy 5 degree days and nights to hot, dusty, dry 35 degree sweltering heat waves were just some of the conditions the Cockburn - Kwinana Youth Rally Team have just experienced, having not

only competed in, but won their class in what is described as the toughest, most gruelling round of the World Rally Championship - Telstra Rally Australia.

Twenty young, enthusiastic and motivated young men and women from the Cockburn and Kwinana areas have guided their Group N Daihatsu Charade De Tomaso rally car through the stages of this world championship event held in and around Perth. The team's number one goal was to make it to the finish line. Not only was this achieved but also a class win in this International World Championship Event!

In only July this year the team was selected to participate in the Youth Rally Project, which aims to focus and promote the road safety awareness message to the community, particularly the youth driver population. In five short months, the team has moulded together to create a class conquering team that some World Rally Teams would be proud of. Driver Duane Partridge (19) of Calista and co-driver Glen Hancock (16) of Spearwood were chosen to represent the team in the car and were ably assisted by a service and support crew of 18 which included, mechanics, tyre changers, window cleaners and catering support crew.

Hancock was rumoured by event commentators to be the youngest ever co-driver to compete in Telstra Rally Australia. He guided Partridge through the stages and kept him on track for the achievement of the class win.

"An awesome experience that I will never forget. I can't thank the team enough for helping us get to the finish of the event. The class win was

completely unexpected but shows the true professionalism of the Cockburn - Kwinana Youth Rally Team, "said Hancock.

The crew started the event seeded as car 79 on the traditional super special stage Langley Park on Thursday night which saw thousands of spectators in the stands and millions world wide



getting a glimpse of the world's best drivers. Car 79 was the first car on the stage and impressed with a respectable time that could only be improved on throughout the next few days of competition.

Friday saw the action move to Mundaring and several retirements at the front of the field saw the Cockburn-Kwinana Youth Rally car slowly move through the field to finish the day in a very credible 63rd position overall and leader of class N2. The stages in and around Harvey and Collie on Saturday were to see the crew suffer some brake dramas but they still managed to hold position and finish the day in 53rd position.

Sunday was a day to consolidate, with only four stages to be completed in the Sotico Pine Plantation at North Bannister that included the now infamous jumps and water splash. Partridge and Hancock now also had a slipping clutch and would drive for the finish, the team had achieved their primary goal, 50th outright and first in class N2.



MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT BETWEEN COUNCILS

A Mutual Aid Agreement is now in place between the Councils of Cockburn, Kwinana, Rockingham and Serpentine-Jarrahdale.

The agreement is designed to provide a system of mutual aid in emergency situations between the four Councils covered by the agreement. It will facilitate attendance by Rangers from all Councils at incidents that occur across Council boundaries from time to time. It is envisaged that this agreement will be further extended to include other Metropolitan councils that border the four already party to the agreement.

Some time ago a vehicle accident involving a sheep transporter resulted in sheep being let loose at the intersection of the Freeway and Rowley Road. Mutual cooperation between Cockburn, Kwinana and Armadale Ranger services eventually had the situation under control.

The agreement will also assist officers in stopping the nuisance caused by off road and trail bike riders who often ride in and out of council boundaries as well as for other incidents that form part of the day to day activities for all rangers.
