## City raises funds for homelessness

City of Cockburn Support Services staff donned pyjamas at work on Friday, 8 August and braved the cold for a night to raise about \$2,000 to help combat homelessness.

The City's 'Sleep-in for Homelessness' encouraged City staff to spend a night at the Atwell Community Centre to experience homelessness and enlist sponsors for the evening to raise funds for the Warrawee women's refuge.

In addition to this the City's Support Services team donned their pyjamas for the day to represent the warm, cosy bed that many Australians don't have the privilege of sleeping in each night and collected donations from their colleagues.

A total of \$1924 was raised from these events, including a dollar-for-dollar matching of funds by the City for all employee donations.



## The Giant Walk

The City of Cockburn has claimed victory over the City of Fremantle by attracting more staff and residents to take part in the Giant Walk - Australian World Record Attempt.

One hundred and sixty eight people joined City of Cockburn Mayor Stephen Lee and City of Fremantle Mayor Peter Tagliaferri in wet conditions to complete two laps of Wilson Park, or 1km, to be counted towards the national tally in a bid to claim the world record from Canada for the most people simultaneously walking one kilometre.

# City welcomes American Sister City delegates

The City of Cockburn is proud to welcome delegates from our American Sister City Mobile who will be visiting Cockburn this month and be joining us at the annual Spring Fair.

Students from Murphy High School will travel to Cockburn and perform as a band at the Spring Fair. They will also visit Hamilton Senior High School and enjoy some of Perth's tourist attractions.

As part of the Spring Fair celebrations representatives from the delegation will join City of Cockburn Mayor Stephen Lee to unveil the City's Friendship Way public artwork that recognises the relationship between Mobile and Cockburn.

Mayor Lee said: "The Sister City relationships held by Cockburn represent aspects of Cockburn's culture and present opportunities for mutually beneficial exchanging of ideas and promotion of trade, tourism and other opportunities for Cockburn internationally.

"It's fantastic to have the group of young Americans visit Cockburn and be part of the Spring Fair celebrations and I look forward to a long running and positive Sister City relationship with Mobile for many years to come."

The new Friendship Way in Spearwood represents the naval links between the history of Cockburn, both of which have very prominent ship-building industries, and is decorated in the colours of yellow and purple which symbolise Mobile's official Mardi Gras colours.





# Cockburn industry shape up

Assisted by its partners the Swan Catchment Council, the City's industrial auditors have been busy assessing businesses in the Cockburn area for their impact on the environment and to assist owners to achieve more sustainable practices.

The audit, which works with business owners to ensure that their operation meets minimum environmental standards, is currently reviewing the Bibra Lake Industrial Area having already visited 70 businesses in Cockburn Central and Jandakot.

City of Cockburn Industrial Premises Officer Nick Stingemore said 'It is encouraging to see local industry taking affirmative action to reduce their environmental impact. Many proprietors are now seriously considering the benefits that sustainable practices, such as energy and water efficiency and waste recycling, can bring to their business'.

Mr Stingemore added that if a business is causing a negative impact on the local environment, or is conducting unapproved activities, the City tries to assist that business to improve it's practices before taking an enforcement approach.

The use of technology such as dust extraction systems, spray booths with correct filters and basic items such as mechanical parts washers and oil separators are examples of simple processes which allow many small local industries to conduct safe, clean and low impact businesses.

Red Rock Oilfield Services Manager Ronnie Milne said working with the City of Cockburn assists his businesses to achieve the best possible practices to minimise impact on the environment.

An area of concern that has been noted during this project is the number of businesses conducting spray painting and/or abrasive blasting in the open. Current requirements are that both these potentially high negative impact activities must be conducted inside an approved booth designed to filter or contain all particulate materials. These businesses will be targeted for early compliance.



## Lights on at Coolbellup skate park

Avid skaters in Cockburn can now practice their sport after-dark with the recent installation of flood lighting at the City of Cockburn's Coolbellup skate park.

The lighting, which will be turned on from sun down until 9pm nightly, were installed by the City as a matter of public safety and to provide a free after-hours recreation venue for residents.

The City invites all skaters to enjoy the lit up park located at Len Packham Reserve on the corner of Cordelia Ave and Tybalt Place in Coolbellup.



## Help contain dieback

New signs advising areas of bushland affected with the devastating fauna disease Dieback will soon be installed across the City and we need your help to protect our natural environment.

The signs clearly identify areas infested with Dieback and alert people entering those areas to use the provided scrubbing stations to clean their boots to prevent spreading the disease.

An initiative of WA's Project Dieback team, the universal signs will be installed throughout the State's metropolitan and South West so please keep an eye out for them when your next visiting a national park or bushland and help us fight Dieback.

## DIEBACK PROTECTION AREA



The presence of Phytophthora dieback is being mapped to help prevent further spread of dieback by human activity.

Phytophthora dieback is an introduced plant killing water mould that lives in soil and plant material. It is devastating the natural heritage of southwest Australia, threatening not only plants but also many unique animal habitats. Banksia communities are particularly susceptible.

Phytophthora dieback can be transported by human activity, carried on boots and tyres and moved in plant material.





## Heritage Inventory


The City of Cockburn is reviewing its Heritage Inventory and is calling on nominations from members of the public as to what natural and man made assets should be included on the list.

# Cockburn Project Update

---

## Road Improvements

**Russell Road realignment** - expected completion October 2008.

This \$3.3 million project includes the installation of traffic signals at the intersection of Russell road and Brushfoot Boulevard/MacQuarie Boulevard, the installation of underground power, and street lighting.

**Spearwood Avenue extension** - works completed at the intersection of Spearwood Ave and Hamilton Road with works in progress at the intersection of Cockburn Road.

This site will host the City of Cockburn's Friendship Way in recognition of our Sister City relationship with American city Mobile, Alabama.

## Cockburn recycles your waste

The new recycling transfer station at Henderson Waste Recovery Park opened on a trial basis in August and has proven to be very successful in recycling domestic waste, reducing landfill waste and increasing safety on site.

## Environment News

Recent midge sampling has commenced in the City's wetlands and lakes.

The City has submitted grant applications to assist in funding rehabilitation programs at Coogee Beach and Market Garden Swamp.

All City of Cockburn facilities and street lighting have been converted to natural power.

## Parks Improvements

The City's Croatian Sister City Friendship Way works continue with the addition of the Croatian welcome "Dobra Dosli" and the planting of new pencil cedars.

The City has also installed its newest Sister City Friendship Way to recognise our relationship with the American city of Mobile.

Five new playgrounds have been ordered and will be installed throughout the City and seven parks will have drinking fountains installed.



The City has undertaken more detailed analysis of some aspects of the Phoenix Central Revitalisation project and the final strategy will now be considered by Council in coming months. The following is a summary of the feedback of the main issues expressed by the community through the community consultation phase. Full results are available at [www.cockburn.wa.gov.au/phoenixcentral](http://www.cockburn.wa.gov.au/phoenixcentral).

## Zoning Issues

- Majority support for the opportunity to develop/subdivide in the future.
- Concerns about high-rise mixed business causing overlooking.
- Suggestions for height limits and design guidelines.
- Density radiating from the centre was supported.
- Need to improve/increase public open spaces.

## New Community Hub Issues

- Majority support of the idea of creating a new community hub on the City's administration site.
- Majority support of the new mixed use café street creating more restaurants and lifestyle opportunities.
- Generally supportive of new Life Learning Centre (integrating a new and enlarged Spearwood Library and Senior Citizen Centre).
- Generally supportive of creating a town park and town square and the idea of creating a central meeting and community place.
- Concerns about demolition of the dental clinic through the realignment of Coleville Crescent.
- Concerns about ensuring that there is sufficient parking.
- Objections and/or concerns about high rise causing social, traffic and overlooking problems.
- Suggestions that the City ensure safety/security in design and disability access.
- Suggestions for aged person housing on the bowling club site.

## Transport Issues

- Strong objections to any new road linkages where properties may be resumed.
- General concerns about traffic increasing on residential streets.
- Concerns about traffic increasing on Gerald Street and its impact on the primary school.
- Concerns about the bus lane on Rockingham Road.
- The need to improve the pedestrian crossings across Rockingham Road.
- Supportive of plans to improve footpaths, lighting and landscaping on key streets to encourage walking, cycling and use of public transport.
- Ideas for a CAT bus servicing the study area and other centres and better public transport.

## Park Issues

- Strong objections to the idea of allowing retirement housing to be built on MacFaull Park.
- Generally supportive of the ideas for upgrading facilities and parks.
- Support for the redevelopment of Beale Park.
- Suggestions for better lighting, seating, barbecue areas, security, play equipment and trees.

## Council's Response To Date

Council has already made a decision at its July Council Meeting:

- 1) Not to support the compulsory acquisition of any residential property within the Phoenix Central project area for the purpose of creating new road links and the road links going through homes being deleted;
- 2) Not to support the inclusion of a busway or transit way in Rockingham Road; and
- 3) Not to proceed with the development of aged person development on MacFaull Park.

The City is ensuring that all these issues are adequately reflected in the final Strategy.




