Is Cockburn prepared for a major disaster?

Fire and Emergency Services Authority of WA (FESA) is another organisation that sits on the City's Local Emergency Management Committee (LEMC).

The City set up this committee to adopt an emergency management plan so it is prepared in the event of a large-scale emergency such as tsunami, oil spill, aircraft accident, earthquake, terrorist attack, mass flooding and fire.

FESA assists with the management of Cockburn's local bushfire brigades. It provides funds for the operational needs of all brigades as well as fire fighting and emergency service vehicles and equipment on a rotational basis.

In the event of a disaster, FESA is able to support local governments with resources including equipment and senior officers to manage the incident.

It is important to remember if there is an emergency, you should always call 000 at first instance and the person answering the call will direct your call to the service required - fire, police or ambulance.

Introducing the City's Environmental Health Services team

The City's Environmental Health Services team aims to ensure that the standards of public and environmental health for residents, workers and visitors to the City are maintained at a high standard. Environmental Health Officers (EHO's) carry out a regulatory role auditing food premises, public buildings, industries and other premises licenced and/or regulated under the Health and Environmental Protection acts. EHO's attend to complaints and enquiries about a huge range of public health issues including asbestos, noise, dust, unfit food and/or poor labelling, mosquitoes, and contaminated sites.

EHO's and Health Promotion Officers provide training for food handlers and coordinate healthy lifestyle programs. Using State Government funding and in partnership with the South Metropolitan Public Health Unit, two new programs including 'Be Active Cockburn' have commenced in 2008. These programs aim to encourage our residents to increase rates of regular physical activity, and to reduce the prevalence of smokers and minimise people's exposure to passive smoke in the City.
