Sister City Visit a success

The City of Cockburn's first visit to its Sister City of Split, Croatia, since the agreement was formed in 1998, proved to be an overwhelming success. The delegation of five Cockburn representatives, lead by Deputy Mayor Kevin Allen, attended the annual Split 'Sudamja' Festival from 5 – 9 May 2008. The highlight was the solemn mass held in honour of the City's patron Saint Domnius, which attracted an estimated 400,000 attendees.

While the Cockburn delegation was in Split, it also made presentations to a youth organisation centre (known as 'Info Zone'), the Split Chamber of Commerce, the Australian Ambassador to Croatia and the Mayor and Members of the City of Split.

The City was represented by Deputy Mayor Kevin Allen, Cr Tony Romano, City of Cockburn Director of Community Services Don Green, Croatian community delegate Melinda Simich and 2007 Deputy Youth Mayor Jade Castle.

Cockburn Coast public comment open

The Planning and Infrastructure Minister Alannah MacTiernan released the draft Cockburn Coast district structure plan for public comment on Saturday 14 June 2008. The plan is open for public comment until 15 September 2008.

The new vision proposes to transform the coastline from a home for noxious industries into one of Perth's premier residential precincts. It represents an exciting new stage in the redevelopment of our coastline that began with the Port Coogee project.

For the past 11 years, the City of Cockburn has been working closely with the Department for Planning and

Infrastructure on behalf of the WA Planning Commission, and in coordination with the City of Fremantle, to drive a new vision for the areas now commonly known as South Beach through to Port Coogee - an area of more than 3330 hectares.

Mayor Stephen Lee said, "Cockburn Coast is an exciting urban renewal project that will ultimately be home to up to 10,800 new residents. We are really forging ahead with this and other exciting projects. The Port Coogee and South beach developments have been a fantastic start to the revitalisation of this forgotten coastal area."





Old South Fremantle Power Station



Divided into seven precincts, the project will contain a mix of medium to high density residential, mixed use and mixed business developments, with provision for community facilities, including a school site. Guided by the principles of sustainability, the plan promotes transit oriented development through the clustering of activity around a central public transport spine, with bus rapid transit proposed to service the area in the short to medium term. It also includes initiatives relating to energy efficiency, water sensitive urban design, affordable housing and employment self sufficiency. The regeneration of the South Fremantle Power Station will form the heart of the project area, being the foundation for the development of a new town centre.

Weekly recycling trials continue

Following the success of a weekly recycling collection service undertaken last year, in partnership with the South Metropolitan Regional Council, the City intends to conduct a further trial this year with a view to potentially providing a regular weekly service by 2010.


More than 300 homes in Cockburn were involved in a trial last year over a six-month period during which their yellow-topped recycling bins were collected weekly rather than fortnightly.

Of the homes invited to be included in the study 90% responded positively, contributing to a projected increase in the amount of recyclable material able to be collected in Cockburn by 50%.

Council allocated funds in the 2008-09 budget towards a secondary study phase for the project that will affect more homes and is hoping to have the weekly collection service in place by 2010.

Cockburn students speak out

Students from six Cockburn primary schools took part in a two-day program that asked them to discuss and record their views on their community and the world.

Hosted by not-for-profit organisation Millennium Kids, the TravelSmart2Schools Sustainability Roadshow was run at the Wetlands Education Centre on 17 and 18 June.

Schools and community planting days

The City of Cockburn has completed an extensive program of native tree planting within several of the City’s natural areas and reserves.

Four highly successful community planting days were conducted in June with over 6000 plants being planted by local residents. Over 50 residents attended these activities which shows that community spirit is alive and well in Cockburn.

In addition to the community planting sessions, 9 primary schools, including students from Bibra Lake Primary and Harmony Primary, participated in their own planting activities at locations such as Bibra Lake and Freshwater Drive Reserve. Students enjoyed learning about local animals, fungus and how to plant a tree.

Scrap to Gold

The City of Cockburn has joined with Sims Metals to encourage any residents with car bodies or scrap metal to donate it to charity as part of Vincentcare's 'Scrap to Gold' initiative.

With the support of the Peel 4 x 4 Club, the City removed three car bodies from the Lake Coogee Reserve on Saturday 7 June that would have been processed by local business Sims Metals and all money raised donated to the charity.

Unfortunately the car bodies were stolen from their collection point before they were able to be collected.

The City is encouraging any residents or businesses that have excess scrap metal or car bodies to donate it to the 'Scrap to Gold' program that will help Vincentcare raise money for Western Australians with mental illness and people experiencing homelessness.

Sims Metals will collect scrap metal free of charge from any residential, industrial or commercial premise and donate the value of the metal to the charity.
