Grant to help fund Success Regional Sporting and Community Complex

The City of Cockburn has received a grant of \$600,000 from the State Government towards the building of 20 netball courts and a pavilion in Success.

The \$9.7 million Success Regional Sporting and Community complex is expected to be completed in 2010. The grant was received as part of the Department of Sport and Recreation's Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities Fund (CSRFF).

New roads, playing fields, carparking and lighting will be installed at the Hammond Road site with state-of-the-art clubrooms including a function area.

City of Cockburn Mayor Logan K Howlett said the complex will be a major asset, serving the rapidly developing eastern portion of Cockburn.

"Work has already begun on the access road carparking and playing fields which will provide a hub for clubs in Cockburn and a great venue for the thousands of young boys, girls and women that play netball."

"The extensive playing fields will provide the opportunity for the first rugby union club within the City to be established. This area will also be shared with the new adjoining primary school," he said."

Senior/pensioner rates payments

Rates for the new financial year 2009/2010 are due to be issued early in July this year.

Pensioners who have not yet paid their 2008-09 rates are encouraged to do so, in order to obtain the concession available for the current financial year.

Full pensioners who intend to defer their rates payments must pay the Rubbish Service Charge and the Community Security Charge for the current year. These service charges are not eligible to be deferred.

Seniors and part-pensioners are not entitled to defer their rates and must finalise their accounts by mid-June, so that concession claims may be made prior to the new rates for 2009/2010 being issued. Senior and part-pensioners who do not pay their accounts in full will lose their concessional status until such time as all outstanding rates are cleared.

Pensioners who wish to avail of the Centrepay Deductions Service are advised to contact Centrelink or the Rates Service Team.



City of Cockburn Mayor Logan K Howlett, also welcomed Port Coogee's first residents, acknowledging the significance of this milestone in the development's evolution.


"Port Coogee is an exciting addition to the City of Cockburn and the first residents are a significant step towards the integration of the development into our vibrant and growing local community," he said.

This ten year plan was compiled with a focus on conservation and promotion of this area for the residents and future residents of Cockburn to enjoy."

The plan includes fire control, weed management, the management of non-native animals, conservation of natural fauna, rehabilitation works, maintenance of the area and the use of interpretive signage.
