RAIN DID NOT DAMPEN YOUTH ANZAC SPIRIT

Despite the stormy weather on Wednesday, April 17, the rain did not diminish the spirit of the Cockburn Youth **ANZAC** service commemorating the 87th Anniversary of the Gallipoli Landing.

The moving ceremony organised by the Cockburn sub-branch of the RSL (The Returned & Services League) and The City of Cockburn was held at Council's Civic Centre. Originally, the service was planned to take place at the war memorial in Beale Park, Spearwood, following a youth march from the City's administration offices.

Cockburn's Youth Advisory Council, combined with local primary and high school students, played a significant role in conducting the **ANZAC** ceremony. Young people performed the readings and respectfully laid wreaths from each of the schools. Guest speakers included the Minister for Community Development, the RSL State President, and Cockburn Mayor Stephen Lee who

inspired the students with their speeches.

Arthur Stanton, Treasurer of Cockburn's RSL Sub-Branch says he was, "very impressed with the way students demonstrated their respect towards the importance of **ANZAC** Day."

City of Cockburn's Youth Services Coordinator Mary Ashe believes youth relate well to the **ANZAC** spirit due to the similarity in ages between themselves and those who served in Gallipoli in 1915. "Many young people also have family who were in, or are currently serving in, the defence forces", she explains, "especially following situations like Timor and September 11th, **ANZAC** Day is increasing in its significance to youth."

Next year the Youth Advisory Council will be responsible for organising the Youth Parade and Ceremony to help continue the **ANZAC** tradition of youth involvement.

Mayor's Message



From time to time I hear from people who say they want more information about Council's activities, or that they feel we are not interested in their opinions. Nothing could be further from the truth.

We are always looking for, and we are always open to any input from our Community into the decision-making process. Communication between the Community and Council is vital and must be ongoing.

I have listed below a sample of some of the issues about which we have sought Community input over the previous six months

December 2001

Cockburn Central (Thomsons Lake) Draft Regional Centre Structure Plan - we were seeking comments in respect to the proposed draft regional centre structure plan for land located near the intersection of the Kwinana Freeway and Beeliar Drive, Jandakot.

New Planning Policy - we asked for your comments in respect of a new Policy that deals with car parking and garage locations, boundary walls that require consultation with neighbours and other matters that assist in the interpretation of the Residential Planning Codes. The policy was available for inspection at Council's Administration Centre.

January 2002

Surf Lifesaving - we asked for anyone interested in starting a surf lifesaving club at Coogee beach to attend a public meeting.

March 2002

Proposed Road Closure of Osprey Drive - we wanted to hear from any person wishing to lodge an objection, in writing, to the proposed closure of an unmade

portion of Osprey Drive in Yangebup.

Proposed Structure Plan Lots 17 & 18 Hammond Road, Success - Council was seeking comments in respect of a proposed structure plan for the development of a portion of the Hammond Road Development Area.

April 2002

Draft Commercial Strategy - the City is inviting comments on a Draft Local Commercial Strategy prepared for the District. Copies of the Draft Strategy are available for inspection or purchase at Council's Administration Centre. Any person wishing to make a submission on the proposal should do so in writing by 4.00 pm Friday 7 June 2002 to the CEO.

Proposed Pedestrian Access Way Closure - Council officers were investigating a proposal to close the pedestrian access way between Needwell Road and Robertson Place, Bibra Lake.

May 2002

New Planning Policy Ancillary Accommodation on Residential zoned Land - the City was seeking comments in respect of a new Policy that deals with Ancillary Accommodation in a Residential zoned area.

These are just some of the many items for which Council has sought community input. The above items were advertised in either the local press, Cockburn Soundings or our website, www.cockburn.wa.gov.au.

Your opinions are very important to both your Councillors and myself and in keeping with our motto "striving for excellence". If you can think of better ways for Council to let you know about projects, like the ones listed above, please let us know for we exist only to meet the needs of our Community.

Cockburn RSL Sub Branch Profile

The Cockburn RSL (Returned and Services League) is encouraging local people to become members of its Sub Branch. The RSL was formed to ensure that programs cater for the well being, care, compensation and commemoration of currently serving and ex-service Defence Force members and their dependants.

There are many benefits in joining the Cockburn RSL. Socially the organisation provides companionship, camaraderie, meetings, reunions and social events. It additionally provides: awareness of government entitlements, employment programs, hospital visits, assistance in the areas of welfare, advocacy and representation, and is an effective lobby group.

Cockburn RSL Sub Branch secretary Vic Boreham says that people who have served in the defence forces, "realise how good it is to talk with others who share a common experience."



The Cockburn RSL Sub Branch holds weekly social events including the Monday Work Party Drinks, Friday night Bingo and Dinner, and Saturday the branch is open for comradeship.

Membership is open to those who have served in the Australian Defence Forces (ADF) during conflict or Reserve Forces of the ADF. Australian citizens who have served in an approved Peacekeeping force or as a member of the Australian Women's Land Army or a Voluntary Aid Detachment in a Military or Convalescent Hospital are also eligible to join. If you have served in support of the ADF with any

country that is not an enemy of Australia or as an allied citizen you are also welcome to join.

To join the RSL you need to complete an application form and submit it to either the State Branch, or your nearest Sub-Branch.

SURVEY SHOWS SUPPORT FOR BIBRA LAKE CAFÉ

Council has been looking into establishing a cafe/kiosk at Bibra Lake.

A number of people have contacted me wanting to know what's happening with the project.

We are looking into the establishment of a cafe similar to the kiosk at Deepwater Point, Mt Pleasant.

Deepwater Point features both indoor and alfresco dining. It provides seating for approximately 40 people inside, 40 outside and also has a kiosk.

Council has undertaken market research throughout the City on whether we should proceed with the cafe. 73% of respondents said they were in favour of a permanent food and drinks facility being developed at Bibra Lake.

What happens next?

Council will engage the services of a commercial consultant to report on the viability of the project.

The commercial consultant will estimate the number of patrons expected throughout the year. This information will determine the seating capacity and thus the size of the building.

If a cafe is to be built, it will most likely be owned by Council and tendered out to a private operator.

I would like to see the cafe built as soon as possible. However, the design-phase will probably take another year. Planning approvals will also need to be given, financing arranged and tenders sought. This will mean the project will take at least two years before construction begins.

My vision for the cafe is a facility where people can go all-year round, meet their friends, enjoy the facilities and appreciate the natural surrounds of Bibra Lake.

I believe this facility will further improve Bibra Lake's attractiveness as a recreation area for the Cockburn community.

The Green Waste Processing Facility at Canning Vale has now been operating for four months, reducing the amount of green waste being accepted at Henderson Landfill Site. Residents are encouraged to take their green waste to Canning Vale where it is used to produce high quality mulch for use on local soils and road verges to assist water retention and prevent nutrient loss. City of Cockburn residents may use their current tip pass to access the Green Waste Processing Facility. Materials not suitable to be accepted at Canning Vale will still be accepted at Henderson Landfill Site.

The following CLEAN green waste is ACCEPTED at the facility:

Tree Pruning
 Logs and branches up to 350mm diameter
 Grass Mower Clippings
 Palm Fronds

The following items can NOT be disposed at the facility

Green Waste mixed with General waste
 Lawn or Turf
 Palm Trees/ Logs (jams mulcher)
 Stumps and Roots
 Sand and Soil
 General Waste

National Excellence Award

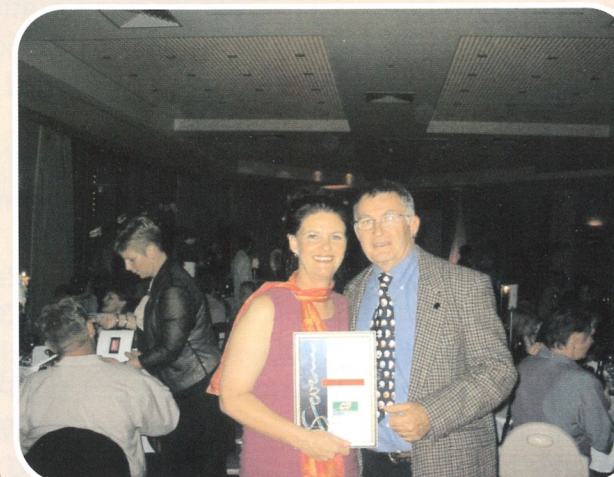
The award was for the "Best Promotion of a Swim School" in Australia. The winning promotion was done in connection with Milo as a registered Swim School with Swim Australia.

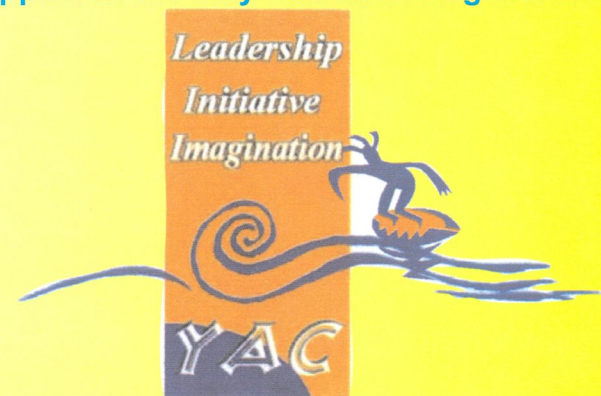

workshop and the parents were raving about it."

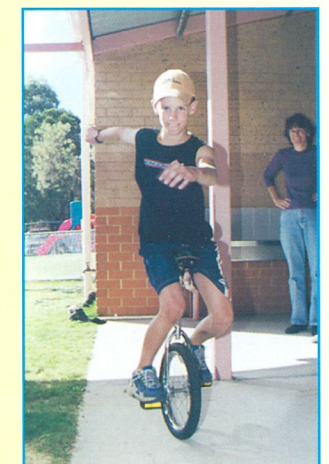
The aim of the workshop was to enhance the children's co-ordination, strength, flexibility, physical

The City funded the Circus Skills Workshops as part of its recreational disability budget.

Cockburn Sounds 91.3 FM ...OPENS...

On Sunday, March 24, the City's new radio station Cockburn Sounds 91.3 CC FM (Radio Cultural Portuguesa) was officially opened.

The opening day was a terrific success. Councillor Ian Whitfield attended the event and received the honour of cutting the ribbon with Portuguese Cultural and Recreation Centre's President Manuel Moleirinho. Guests were entertained by a wonderful performance by the choir Tuna De Contabilidade Do Porto and were treated to a traditional Portuguese BBQ style lunch.

Elsa Moleirinho, Secretary of the Portuguese Cultural and Recreation Centre, says that, "the response from the community as a whole, not just the Portuguese community, has been fantastic. The Cockburn community has embraced the radio station and we are hearing nothing but positive feedback from our listeners."

Cockburn Sounds 91.3 CC FM operates from the old Jandakot School on Poletti Road, Jandakot. The station transmits in both Portuguese and English and is currently in the process of adding Spanish programs. The radio frequency was given to the Portuguese Cultural and Recreational Centre by the Australian Broadcasting Authority late last year. It has been broadcasting since December 23, 2001.

As a new radio station, Cockburn Sounds 91.3 CC FM needs support from the community to remain on air. 91.3 CC FM is currently looking for sponsors and is calling for interested volunteers to help out at the station.

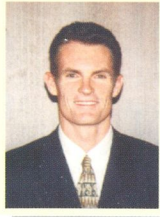

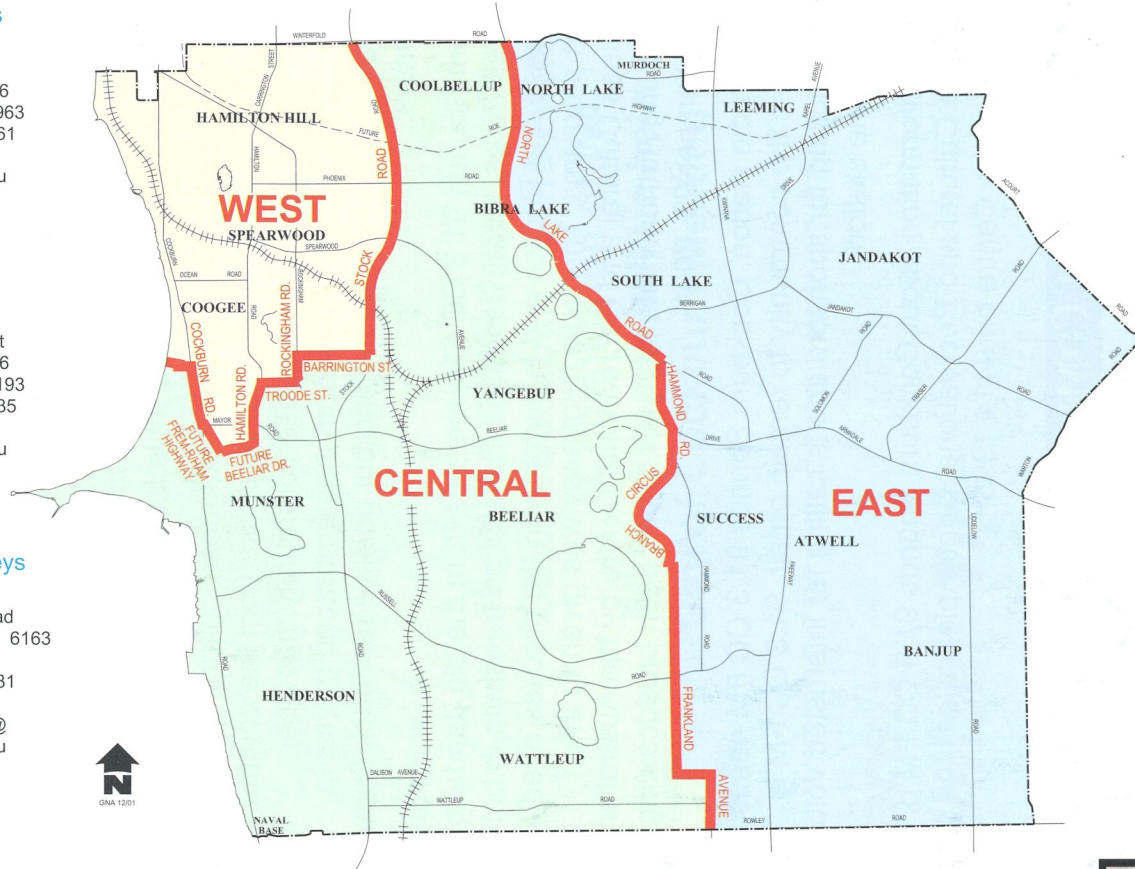
