## Pinakarri community leading by example

With the support of the City of Cockburn, Murdoch University, local businesses and lots of enthusiastic volunteers, sustainability award winning Pinakarri Community, in Hamilton Hill, has been awarded a \$50,000 Community Water Grant, funded by the Australian Government Water Fund.

The grant has two parts:

- The installation of water saving technologies to reduce their consumption of scheme water
- Raising public awareness of being waterwise at home through workshops and promotion in the local community

Pinakarri has installed an innovative greywater reuse system – the first of this type in Cockburn – where bathroom and laundry wastewater is collected from several households in underground tanks and treated with ozone, which kills bacteria, viruses and other nasties.

The treated water is then reused to irrigate the Community's central lawn and fruit trees via a waterwise sub-surface system, all approved by the Health Department and City of Cockburn.

In addition to the greywater reuse system the Pinakarri Community has also installed a rainwater harvesting system, with three tanks collecting and storing a total of 14,000 litres of rainwater.

The rainwater tanks have been plumbed into toilets and washing machines and switch automatically to scheme water when the rainwater runs out.

"We've calculated that we can reduce our water consumption by 60% - that's a reduction of 800,000 litres per year! It's a great challenge and we're very happy to be able to make a difference," Pinakarri spokesperson Melissa White said.

"We're keen to spread the word and help others to do the same."

"As a commendable sustainability initiative, City of Cockburn does not charge the usual fees for greywater applications, so combined with the \$500 greywater and the \$600 rainwater State Government Waterwise Rebates, living more sustainability becomes a little easier!"

City of Cockburn mayor Stephen Lee said the example being shown by the Pinakarri community is fantastic.

"Here we have not one but two initiatives in place to absolutely make the most of every drop of water that is used by the community. I cannot express how delighted I am with the responsible steps the group has made and I encourage anybody in the community to find out ways that you can make your property more water-wise."

## The City of Cockburn reduces carbon footprint

Here at the City of Cockburn we are very proud of the steps we are taking to reduce our carbon footprint and work towards a 'Better Tomorrow'.

Some of our achievements include:

- Changing the lighting and installing pool blankets at South Lake Leisure Centre has resulted in a saving of nearly 200 tonnes of Carbon dioxide equivalent per year (equivalent to taking 47 cars off the road per year)
- By changing over to 100% Natural Power in the Admin building and Spearwood Library we have saved over 1000 tonnes of CO2 equivalent in the past year (equivalent to taking 233 cars off the road per year)
- By sending our community green waste and recyclables to the Regional Resource Recovery Centre and the SMRC composting facility we have saved over 16,000 tonnes of CO2 equivalent per year (3,721 cars off the road)
- Our methane capture methods at Henderson Landfill have saved 76,000 tonnes of CO2 equivalent from escaping into the atmosphere in the past year! (17,674 CARS!!)

We are recycling computer equipment that would otherwise go to landfill. This June alone we recycled 72 CRT Monitors, 12 CPU, 8 printers and 5 boxes of misc computer related hardware through Secure Computer Recycling.



## Landowner Biodiversity Grants now open

Revegetation, weed control, habitat creation and dieback management are just a few environmental areas the City of Cockburn assist landowners with as part of the Landowner Biodiversity Grant.

The 2007/08 funding round allowed three landowners to join forces and create an ecological corridor between their properties. This is a great example of how working together within our local community we can make a difference and protect natural bushland and wetlands into the future.

Expressions of interest for the 2008/09 grant round are now open.

## The Lost Generation community art workshops

The Lost Generation refers to a generation of people with intellectual disabilities who have stories to find and tell through the Project.

The Lost Generation Project commenced in January 2007 and over five and a half years will involve around 550 adults with intellectual disabilities who reside in Disabilities Services Commission accommodation in 18 Local Government Areas.

From June 2008 to December 2008, the Lost Generation Project is working in the Cities of Cockburn, Fremantle, Kwinana, Mandurah and Rockingham.

## Grants, Donations And Sponsorship Applications now open

Applications are now open for the following funding opportunities to support local groups, organisations and individuals for a wide variety of activities and services:

**Community Grants** assist local community groups and organisations to provide projects or activities that benefit residents of Cockburn. Applications are to a maximum of \$15,000, with smaller amounts encouraged.

**Donations** are available to provide financial assistance towards the day-to-day running costs of not-for-profit groups, not for a specific project or activity. Donations are limited and highly competitive.

**Sustainable Events Grants** assist local community groups and organisations in the provision of ongoing programs and activities for the benefit of the residents of Cockburn. The maximum grant provided to any one group will be \$7,000, over a four-year period.

**Sponsorship** is a mutually beneficial partnership arrangement where the City of Cockburn makes a financial contribution to a group, organisation or individual for a specific purpose, project, activity or event and, in return, the City receives public recognition for its contribution. The maximum is \$20,000 for organisations and \$2,000 for individuals.

**Cultural Grants** support local arts and cultural activities. Applications to a maximum of \$4,000, with smaller amounts encouraged.

**Youth Art Scholarships** (under 18) are available for those who live in Cockburn and are either doing further study or travelling in relation to their art. These scholarships are to a maximum of \$500 to assist with fees, materials or travel costs.

## City Of Cockburn's Disability Access and Inclusion Plan

The City of Cockburn is committed to ensure that Cockburn is an accessible and inclusive place for people with disabilities, their families and carers to live in. The City recognises that people with disabilities are valued members of the community who make a variety of contributions to local social, economic and cultural life.

According to the Disability Services Act (1993), all local governments are required to have a Disability Access and Inclusion Plan (DAIP). The City of Cockburn's DAIP 2007 – 2012 was endorsed by Council in July 2007 and has since been approved by the Disability Services Commission (DSC).

Over the past year, the City implemented the six desired outcomes of its DAIP across all Departments. The City submitted its first Local Government Authority Progress Report to DSC so that it could then monitor the achievements on the DAIP outcomes.

The six DAIP outcome areas provide a framework for translating the principles and objectives of the Disability Services Act into tangible and achievable results;

- Outcome 1 People with disabilities have opportunities to access the services of, and any event organised by the City of Cockburn
- Outcome 2 People with a disability have the same opportunities as other people to access the buildings and other facilities of the City of Cockburn
- Outcome 3 People with a disability receive information from the City of Cockburn in a format that will enable them to access the information as readily as other people are able to access it

- Outcome 4 People with a disability receive the same level of quality service from the staff of the City of Cockburn as other people do
- Outcome 5 People with a disability have the same opportunity as other people to make complaints to the City of Cockburn
- Outcome 6 People with a disability have the same opportunity as other people to participate in public consultation by the City of Cockburn

The City has shown its commitment in consulting with people with disabilities, their families and carers by facilitating the City of Cockburn Disability Reference Group. This proactive group is made up of consumers and industry representatives. Their role is to ensure that barriers to disability access and inclusion in Cockburn are addressed appropriately. Membership is open to all residents and service providers in the Cockburn area.

As of July 2008, Council has approved to increase the disability Access & Inclusion Officer position from two days per week to full time with the aim of monitoring the DAIP, providing Disability Awareness Training to all City of Cockburn staff and to work with Council and the Community on Disability related matters.

## Meet the team SMP Work crew

The partnership between the City of Cockburn and employment agency for people with a disability, South Metropolitan Personnel (SWC) has proven to be a huge success, with Council approving two additional teams joining the Supported Work Crew Scheme in 2008 making a total of 6 teams and employing 18 young people.

In 2004, the Disability Advisory Committee recognised the need to be proactive in utilising the skills of people with a disability within the City. Their recommendation to Council resulted in this initiative aimed at increasing the representation of people with a disability in the workforce in a paid capacity.

SMP Crew supervisor, Maurice Williamson stated that the Supported Work Crew teams are integral in providing assistance to Parks and Gardens Services as well as Executive Services. The crews supported by their supervisor have been extremely busy helping to maintain many sites including Manning Park, Bibra Lake, Community Centres, Coogee Beach and also with assisting with the setting up and cleaning up of the Council Reception area for meetings and functions.

The City of Cockburn Supported Work Crew employees work on a part time basis and enjoy the same employment conditions as their co-workers, the wages being award-based. The employees are keen and motivated to work and have expressed their enthusiasm. It is about matching abilities with interests resulting in loyalty and longevity of employment. This has proven to be an efficient and cost-effective means of finding the best person for the job.

This partnership has enabled these young people to develop skills and self esteem through employment as they gain a valued status within the community. This employment is a win-win situation for all involved.

As a SWC employee, David Gibson said, "My work colleagues at the City are supportive and I have not experienced any discrimination. It's great to have a laugh and joke with them and be respected for my abilities. We receive a lot of positive comments and feedback from the community and co-workers".





## Smoke free Cockburn

From August 16th the City of Cockburn has banned smoking at its administration office in Spearwood, Council owned buildings and at many public places including beaches and playgrounds.

The ban covers:

- Within 10 metres of all children’s playground equipment
- Within 10 metres of sporting facility building entrances
- Within 10 metres of any other persons on Council playing fields or sporting grounds
- Within 10 metres of any other persons on City of Cockburn beaches, dunes or jetties
- Within all covered bus stops
- Within 10 metres of the entrances of Council owned or managed buildings including balconies or covered areas of the buildings
- At all Council run or sponsored events on its beaches, reserves, parks, ovals and playing fields

CEO Stephen Cain said: “The evidence clearly proves that smoking tobacco and exposure to passive smoke is harmful to health.”

“Western Australia is progressing towards a total ban on smoking tobacco and the City of Cockburn recognizes that it needs to play a role in this movement”.

Residents and visitors to Cockburn will be made aware of the self-regulated smoking ban through signs that will be installed in the affected area.

The City has introduced the no smoking policy with a focus on education and behaviour change rather than punishing those that offend.

“The initial focus will be on behaviour change rather than punitive action. We are hoping that residents and staff who smoke will be encouraged to quit and the City will be providing support courses to staff and the community that need help to quit,” Stephen Cain said.




