# SOUNDINGS



Welcome to Springtime in the City of Cockburn. The City will be host to many community events in the next few months and we hope you enjoy them all. Keep an eye on your events calendar and also on the half-page Cockburn Soundings ad in the Cockburn Herald each fortnight.

While these celebrations of our city and spring occur though, much more important events are unfolding in the lead-up to your election of your new council.

One of the most important dates to remember is 17 October - at 5.00 pm on that day the roll closes and if your name is not on it you won't be eligible to vote.

If your name is on the electoral roll to vote in state and national elections and you live in the City of Cockburn you will be eligible to vote. However if you own property in more than one ward or run a business in a different ward from where you live, you may be eligible to vote for that ward too. If you need advice on your eligibility contact the City's Rates Department on 9411 3475.

Local governments in Western Australia traditionally have a poor turnout at elections, probably because it is not compulsory. Only

around 10% of those eligible to vote did so at the last City of Cockburn election but you can't blame those ten percent for the government you get; you should blame the 90 percent who didn't bother to vote. Hopefully now we have a postal vote more people will vote.

You will be voting to select the three councillors for your ward and everyone will be voting for the mayor. You can be sure there will be plenty of information around in the local newspapers but what about giving the candidates in your area a call to find out if they have the same values as you and work out if you think they will be honest and hardworking for our city.

The November issue of this magazine will carry a photo of all the nominees and a short profile on each of them with their contact details so you are able to talk to them personally. Take the opportunity to make your own opinion, don't rely on the word of others.

Hopefully the next Council will be truly representative of the entire population of our City of Cockburn.

Dr Haultain dispenses care and advice to parents and not just the vaccine to the children.

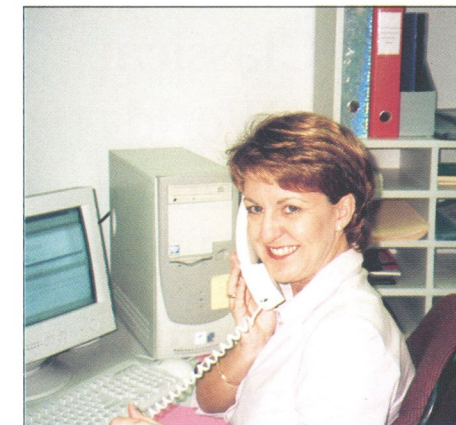
The City would like to thank Dr Haultain and his fellow practitioners at the Lakes

# Children's Book Week

(21-25th August, 2000)

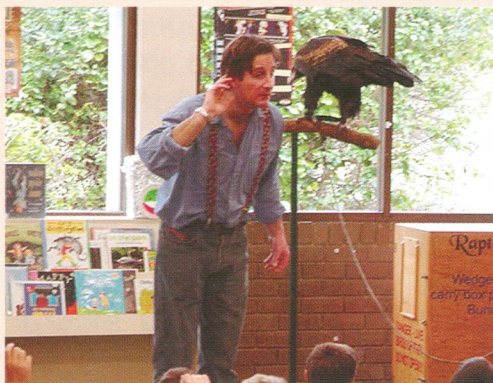
The theme for Children's Book Week this year was "Edge of Tomorrow". This theme was reflected by many of the performers and guests who attended sessions at both Spearwood and Cockburn libraries.

Owen Bell, an illustrator who worked on Thomas the Tank and recently completed the artwork for "Punkie ICQ", showed the traditional tools of his trade such as the airbrush, kneadable eraser (putty), coloured pencils and french curves. He went on to describe the graphics tablet he now uses which is so sensitive that it responds in intensity to the amount of pressure applied to it.

Elizabeth Honey, the illustrator and writer invited by the Children's Book Council talked about her craft and discussed e-books. She said she was looking forward to them because they would be compact and as she grew older she could enlarge the print size.

Zappo the Clown from the Future, brought in his robot "Rusty" and Gretel bugs "Oobie, Scoobie and Doobie" to entertain the children with his madcap humour.

As well as looking at technological change, the theme prompted discussion of how we could preserve our natural environment and history. This was demonstrated to the children in an educational and enjoyable manner by David McReady, "The Birdman", from POWER (Preservation of Wildlife Education Rehabilitation). The children were introduced to Pirate the kestrel, Phantom, the masked owl and Warlock, the wedge tail eagle. As well as learning about Raptors, the children were privileged to witness the loving relationship between David and the birds.



Another hit of Children's Book Week was the storytelling sessions by Don Smith. Not only did he include children from the audience as characters in his multicultural storytelling, but he also used magic to enthrall and capture the crowd.



Alwyn Evans, a local writer and editor talked about the writing and editing process. She held the children's attention with her story of killing the carpet snake at the beach shack and how this became material for one of her books.

Children's Book Week provided children from fifteen local primary schools with opportunities to learn about books, information and

processes. It was a way for children to broaden their horizons and to meet writers, artists, performers and other interesting people from the community and to learn about their lives and stories.

# Apathy Appalling

"I was disappointed with the attendance at the Local Agenda 21 Meeting in August," said Kirsty Stratford, the City of Cockburn Environmental Officer responsible for the meeting.

But then she went on to say, "No, it was more than disappointing, it was appalling to think that so few people are interested in this opportunity to be involved in creating our vision for the future."

"Local Agenda 21 is an opportunity that is not just about the environment: it's a focus for dealing with all the issues confronting our local community, and for that matter the world, but for dealing with them in a community based fashion."

Issues include:

- Economic development
- Social development
- Employment
- Environmental protection and management
- and others

Kirsty continued, "The idea is to create a unified local vision with more accountability to local communities and better information sharing. Sustainability cannot be achieved by government without real community and individual's involvement, consultation and participation. And this needs to be from the beginning of creating the vision for the future, the planning, the implementation and then the review."

Kirsty by this time was sounding very animated about it all and when asked whether she felt passionate, she replied, "I am very passionate about this and so should everyone in the community be passionate about it. Everyone out there should get involved on this one project, if in no others."

Her final words were, "Help create a council/community partnership and contribute to the Cockburn Vision".

## Greening Plan

A draft Greening Plan for the City of Cockburn has been submitted to Council officers and will be considered by Council for adoption.

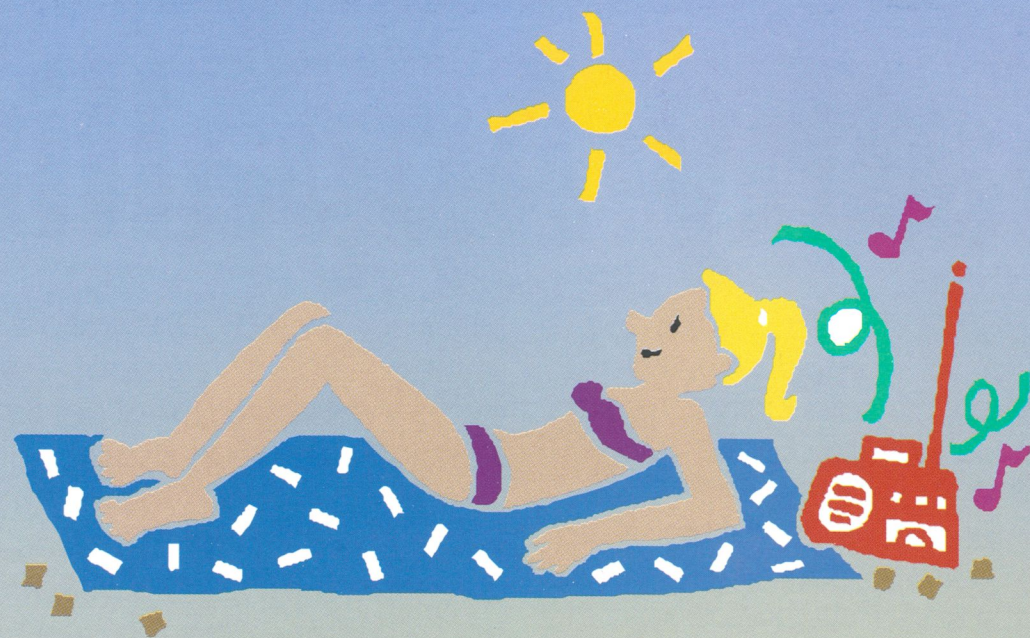
The objective of the plan is to :

*"Develop a long-term strategic plan for the maintenance and enhancement of remnant vegetation within the City of Cockburn, the revegetation of previously cleared areas, road reserves, public land and the enhancement of ecological, landscape and streetscape values and community amenity."*

An audit of our bushland revealed that approximately 30% of the City's area of 4,760ha is bushland and that 50% of that bushland is in good condition. Much of that area lies in the two chains of wetlands that run throughout the city and in already developed areas but a significant amount lies in the area which is zoned either Urban or Urban Deferred and is proposed for future residential development.

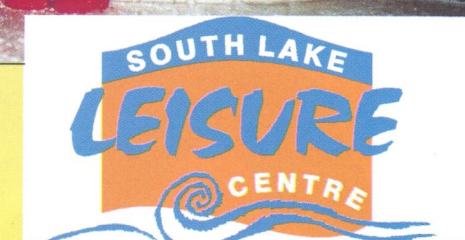

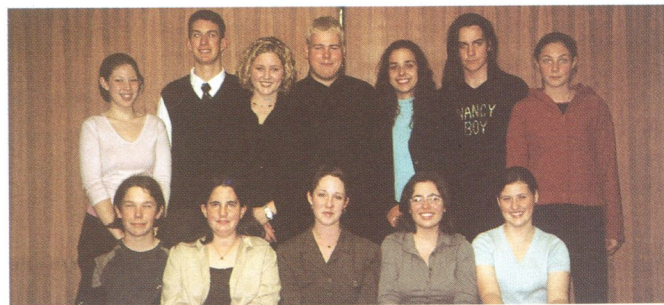

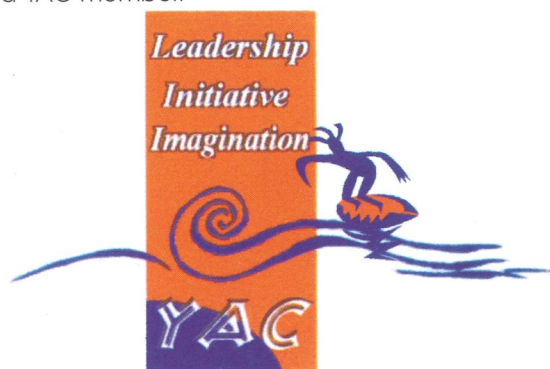

## LOCAL BOY WINS GOLD *for the second consecutive year...*

12 year old Leigh Edwards of Yangebup has just become the first figure skater in Western Australia to achieve back to back Gold Medals at the Australian Figure Skating Championships.

Leigh won the gold medal in the Novice Men's Division of the Australian Figure Skating Championships held here in Perth at the Cockburn Ice Arena from the 29 July 2000 to the 5 August 2000. This was the second gold medal for Leigh as he also won a gold medal in the Primary Men's Division at the Championships held in Adelaide in 1999.

Leigh is at present undefeated in Men's competition in Australia for each of the divisions that he has competed in including 3 other interstate competitions over the last 3 years and is a recipient of the City of Cockburn Travel sponsorship. His next goals are to skate in the Junior Division at the next Championships and represent Australia internationally.

Russian coaches Valentin Kadzevitch and Irina Stavroskiai are Leigh's coaches and have made a remarkable impact on figure skating in WA passing on their knowledge and experience to their students having successfully coached 2 Australian Champions (gold medallists) from Cockburn and a bronze medallist in this years championships.

Leigh's comments were, "I just love to skate. People think it's hard but more people should try it because it doesn't take long and you're not falling over anymore - or if you do the falls are not as bad and they don't hurt as much."

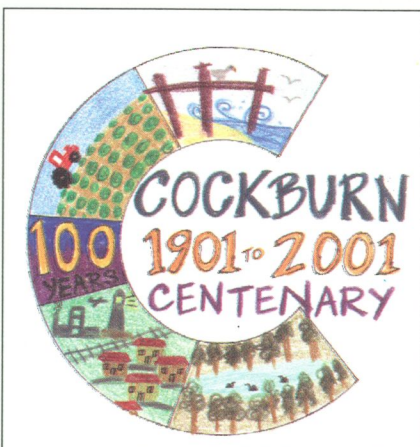


# CELEBRATION OF THE CENTENARY OF FEDERATION

Come 2001 we will have been governing ourselves for 100 years!



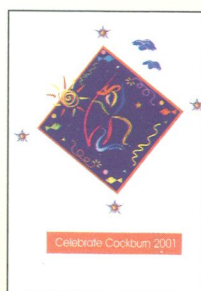
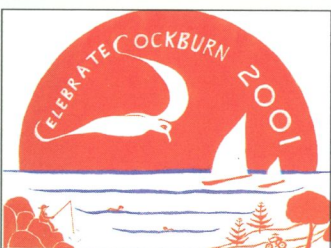
