etland Watch is a wetland conservation initiative of the World Wide Fund (WWF) for Nature in partnership with the Cities of Cockburn and Armadale, Town of Kwinana, Water Corporation, Department of Environment and WA Museum. The aim of Wetland Watch is to promote sustainable management and



conservation of wetlands and associated bushland on private property.

What's so important about Wetlands and why do we need to protect them?

- Wetlands are highly productive systems that support a wide range of plants and animals, many of which are not found in any other environments
- Despite their values, it has been estimated that 80% of wetlands on the Swan Coastal Plain have been filled, drained or cleared. Those wetlands that remain are under increasing threat from a variety of actions
- Many of these remaining wetlands are located on private land. As such their management and conservation is in the hands of private landowners

The City of Cockburn and WWF hope to work with landowners who have wetlands on their properties, and assist them in managing and conserving these wetlands. The scheme is voluntary and there is no obligation on

landowners to be involved. The project will identify wetlands with high conservation values located on private land and then make contact with landowners offering them personalised support, advice and incentives to help them manage and protect their wetlands. Incentives may include technical advice, training, financial assistance, voluntary management agreements and advice on how to legally protect the wetland should owners wish to do so.

A number of educational events will be organised to increase the community awareness of the value of wetlands. Events will include Frog Fest that aims to increase community awareness of frogs and their wetland habitats and a Wetland Discovery Day aimed at community members who wish to increase their awareness of wetlands and associated vegetation and fauna.

Council Focus on New Projects for 2004/05

Cockburn Council will soon start work on a number of new projects.

This is because we recently adopted our budget for the financial year 2004/2005.

We know that the rates bill is a tax on your land and property, and that most people find it difficult to pay.

For this reason, we carefully considered how to spend your money.

We decided that this year there should be a zero increase in the rates.

This means that, for residential properties, the minimum rate has been set at \$438 for the second year in a row.

The vast majority of other local governments in the state increased their rates this year - we were rare in not doing so.

Some of the new works and services for this year include:

 The expansion of the gym at South Lake Leisure Centre, with a new cardio theatre so that people can watch TV whilst they exercise, using individual earphones.



- The construction of a second carriageway on North Lake Road between Berrigan Drive and Hammond Road.
- Funding for a Senior Citizens Drop-in Centre.
- A mobile youth centre service run by the YMCA.
- The opening of Spearwood Library to customers on Wednesdays for the first time.

We have also part funded a proposed Youth Centre near Gateways Shopping Centre.

I hope that if the facility is eventually built, it will include a state-of-the-art music recording facility and technology centre for our young people.

Illegal Structures - What Do You Need a Building Application For? You must have approval from Council's Building Department before you:

Begin any proposed construction (even simple garden sheds); erect new front fences or rebuild old ones within the front setback; fill in or excavated a site for building works; build a retaining wall; construct a swimming pool or spa; make alterations or additions to a strata title building.

Commencing building without a Building Licence from Council's Building Department is illegal and may subject you to prosecution.

Tragically, 2 children drown in Australia every week. Often these drownings are preventable.

Supervision - the most important thing you can do is watch children closely whenever they are near the water.

Minimise household risks - empty wading pools, never leave children alone in the bath, cover fish ponds, put lids on buckets and eskies.

Fence your pool - always keep the gate shut. Keep toys, balls and anything that might attract children, clear of the water.

Know what to do in an emergency - learn CPR (resuscitation).

CITY OF COCKBURN FIRE CONTROL 2004/05

1. LAND WHICH IS LESS THAN 2,032M² IN AREA AND ZONED RESIDENTIAL 1 OCTOBER 2004 – 31 MAY 2005.

The owner or occupier shall clear, to the satisfaction of Council or its duly authorised Officer, all inflammable matter from the whole of the land except living trees, shrubs, and plants under cultivation and lawns. This is required to be cleared by **1 October 2004 and kept clear until 31 May 2005.** The vegetation may be cleared by mowing/slashing or other approved methods as close to the ground as possible and not allowing it to re-grow any greater than a depth of 50mm. This to be completed to the satisfaction of Council's Authorised Fire Control Officer.

AREAS ZONED RESIDENTIAL

NO BURNING ALLOWED.

Garden Refuse previously permitted to be burned in a single pile measuring 1M³ on the ground between the hours of 6.00 pm and 11.00 pm is now <u>NOT PERMITTED.</u>

- 2. LAND WHICH IS GREATER THAN 2,032M² IN AREAS SHALL HAVE A TRAFFICABLE FIREBREAK MINIMUM OF THREE (3) METRES WIDE 30 NOVEMBER 2004 31 MARCH 2005.
 - (i) immediately inside all external boundaries of the land, (four sides);
 - (ii) immediately surrounding all buildings (if any) situated on the land
 - and
 - (iii) immediately surrounding all fuel dumps and ramps (if any) on the land.

"Trafficable Firebreak" means ground from which all flammable material (which includes vegetation and with all overhanging branches, trees, limbs, etc to be trimmed back clear of the Firebreak area) has been removed and on which no flammable material (which includes vegetation) is permitted during the period between **30 November 2004 and 31 March 2005.** The area of the Firebreak must be able to be transversed by a Fire Unit or Truck carrying Fire Crew on the back so as not to cause them any injury.

AREAS ZONED RURAL AND OTHER AREAS

PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD 1 December and 31 March 1 October to 30 November 1 April to 31 May

PERMITS TO BURN MUST BE OBTAINED PRIOR TO BURNING

3. ALTERNATIVE SITUATIONS

0

If for any reason an owner or occupier considers it impractical to clear their land in accordance with the above, the owner or occupier should apply in writing to Council no later than 31 October 2004 for a Variation to Firebreak for approval to construct a Firebreak in an alternative position on his or her land. If Council, or its duly Authorised Fire Control Officers do not approve the application for an alternative Firebreak, then the owner or occupier shall comply with all the requirements of this Fire Control Order.

An approval to construct an alternative Firebreak shall only remain in force until a change of ownership of the land following the date of the grant of the approval. If having been granted approval, the owner or occupier fails to comply with the variation order by the due date, then the provisions of this Fire Control Order shall apply. Council reserves the right, at any time, to revoke, alter or add to the provisions of this variation order.

Where an owner or occupier of land fails or neglects to comply with any requirements of this Fire Control Order within the time specified, Council's Authorised Fire Control Officers with such employees and/or contractors, vehicles and machinery as the Officer deems necessary, may enter upon the land and do all such things as necessary pursuant to this Fire Control Order and may recover costs and expenses of doing so in the relevant Court from the owner or occupier of the land in accordance with the Bush Fires Act 1954 (as amended) in addition to any penalty which might be imposed and may include a penalty not exceeding \$1000. Fines, which can be levied, are in the sum of \$250 for each offence.

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u> restricted and prohibited burning periods can be varied at the discretion of Council because of weather conditions. Permit holders are responsible to verify the current dates with the Council. <u>PERMITS TO BURN MUST BE OBTAINED</u>

PRIOR TO BURNING

WITHOUT ANY EXCEPTION,

NO FIRE may be lit on a day when the fire danger is declared as VERY HIGH or EXTREME.
