BUSH FIRE SEASON



As we approach summer, it is important for all landowners to prepare their property for the potential threat of bushfire. A new Fire Control Order (FCO) has recently been adopted by the City to reduce fire hazards within Cockburn.

The FCO allows residents within rural zoned areas to burn garden refuse and bush without a fire permit between 1 June and 30 September each year. During the restricted burning periods (1 April to 31 May and 1 October to 30 November), residents within rural zoned areas may burn up to 1m³ (cubic) without a fire permit. Volumes larger than this will require a fire permit to be issued by the City's Rangers. These dates may change pending seasonal conditions, so it's important to contact the City before commencing any burning.

Burning of garden refuse in areas not zoned rural is prohibited throughout the year and may result in an infringement notice and possibly prosecution. Burning of household waste is also prohibited in all areas of the City of Cockburn.

The FCO also specifies the physical works relating to firebreaks required to be undertaken by the owner or occupier, and these differ depending on the size of a property. These works must be completed before 1 November of each year and may be subject to inspection by an authorised Bushfire Control Officer until 15 April the following year.

The City recommends all residents familiarise themselves with the Fire Control Order to ensure full compliance with requirements.

Meet the City's Child Care Services Team

The City of Cockburn is the approved provider of two home-based child care services, Family Day Care and In-Home Child Care, which operate throughout the City and extend across Perth's southern suburbs.

The Child Care Services (CCS) team currently has six staff members supporting 60 Family Day Care (FDC) Educators to provide early childhood education and care for 400 children, and 30 In-Home Care (IHC) Educators who care for 60 children.

The FDC Service has operated since 1978 providing child care within the approved home of a registered FDC Educator, while the IHC Service has operated since 2001 with the registered IHC Educator providing care within the child's family home.

The services are supported by a team of professional staff and Commonwealth childcare subsidies are available for eligible families. Staff roles include Educator Support Officers, an Educational Leader, administration staff, an IHC Service Co-ordinator and CCS Manager.

Both services provide quality early childhood education and care for a

small group of children in each setting. All families seeking care have access to FDC but only families who meet specific Commonwealth criteria have access to IHC.

These services are being sought by a growing number of families in the area, so expressions of interest are encouraged from applicants interested in becoming registered educators.


MANAGING MIDGES AND MOSQUITOES



Midge

The City has begun its seasonal midge monitoring program.

This monitoring will record larvae numbers within individual wetlands, to determine the potential for midge outbreaks.



The City is minimising elevated levels of midge through revegetation, reducing nutrient inflows in lakes and maintaining midge lights.

Intensive midge monitoring will be carried out until April 2016.

Mosquitoes

Mosquitoes generally breed in higher numbers in warmer months and can occasionally spread disease-causing viruses. It is important for residents to be aware of how to avoid mosquito bites.

Tips:

- Avoid exposure to mosquitoes for the first few hours after dusk
- Wear protective clothing when outdoors
- Use a personal repellent
- Install insect screens
- Use mosquito nets and mosquito-proof tents when camping and outdoors
- Protect infants and children with suitable clothing, bed nets or other forms of insect screening.

Members of Cockburn Community Care Social Clubs can now enjoy specialised health and wellbeing activities thanks to a new partnership between Cockburn Community Care and Curtin University Clinics.

Occupational therapy, physiotherapy, nursing, speech pathology and social work students are involved in this program and are based at Curtin Clinics including Cockburn Health and Community Facility, as part of their studies.

The students will assist in delivering a number of health programs through the partnership including the Healthy Eating and Activities Lifestyle (HEAL) program with the Kwobarup Aboriginal Club as well as designing and running activities for the seniors groups on a Friday.

HEAL is an eight-week program that is tailored to meet the needs of the local Aboriginal community. This includes education around nutrition and healthy eating, followed by physical activity. The

physical activity component is adjusted to suit the needs of individuals. This can range from chair-based exercise to line dancing and strength and resistance training.

The Friday seniors group, in collaboration with staff and students, have implemented activities to improve balance, mobility, cognition and social interaction in a fun and exciting way. This involves the use of games and activities to improve these aspects of wellbeing. Group members experiencing difficulties with independent living or deterioration are identified as 'at risk' and more intensive input is provided to maintain the client's function at home.

There have been a large number of students and clients that come from varying multicultural backgrounds. Both clients and students have reported positive learning experiences and shared knowledge.

COCKBURN DRIVING RESIDENTS TO HEALTH

The groundswell of community support generated by the Community Connect South (CCS) initiative to reduce traffic congestion in the Cockburn and Armadale area has translated into real action on the political lobbying front.

The Australian Government's recent commitment of \$116 million to support critical infrastructure upgrades to Armadale Road is a huge boon for the CCS project. The Federal funding announcement comes on the back of Labour's commitment of a combined \$145 million in funding to widen Armadale Road and \$25 million address other road infrastructure issues.

Since the commencement of the CCS campaign in late August, more than 18,000 emails have been sent to both State and Federal Members of Parliament and by-election candidates.

CCS seeks \$290 million in Federal Government funding for two major road projects to reduce chronic traffic congestion on Armadale Road and in

the Cockburn Central area linking two major activity centres and people to jobs:

1. A dual carriageway for the length of Armadale Road. Cost: \$130 million.
2. A bridge and freeway interchange linking Armadale Road and North Lake Road either directly or via Verde Drive. Cost: \$160 million.

Both Cockburn and Armadale have been highly active in the community with a number of community engagement events already taking place at Cockburn Central Train Station, along Armadale Road, and at various shopping centres.

The Community Connect South initiative will continue to campaign for funding to support the implementation of the entire CCS project. In 1898, Walter Powell, an accountant in Fremantle, was granted a liquor license for a small hotel opposite Coogee Beach known as Four-Mile Well, a property owned by his wife Letitia. He called it Powell's Coogee Hotel.

He immediately set about extending and improving the property and turned the area

into a sporting haven and picnic spot, calling it 'The Garden of the West'. Local clubs of cricket, hunting, cycling, shooting and horseracing all met at the hotel or stopped for a drink. Powell built a racecourse beside his hotel and set up prizes to encourage local owners to participate.

Powell died in 1923, and in 1927 the de-licensing board decided there were too many hotels in the area, and withdrew the Powell's Coogee Hotel liquor license. Around this time, Powell's brother-in-law Jock McKinnon opened a small shop and post office on the hotel grounds.

In 1931, the now-empty hotel was purchased by the Anglican Church to be a holiday home for their orphans, used only during the summer months. In 1946, fearing it would be overtaken by squatters desperate for housing in a post-war shortage, they renovated it and opened a permanent home there.

The house remained an orphanage until 1968, when Main Roads bought it and announced it was resuming the land to build a high-capacity road to Rockingham. The orphans moved out, but the Hotel was not knocked down, instead becoming headquarters for the Coogee Progress Association.

A north wing was added in the 1990s and the site was heritage listed in 2001.

CITY WINS STATE HEALTH AWARD



The City has been named the winner of the 2015 WA Heart Foundation Local Government Awards.

The City's public health initiatives are targeted at the nearly 75 per cent of adult residents in the Cockburn community who are identified as overweight or obese.

The City is currently running:

- HEAL – an eight-week exercise and health education program
- Heartmoves – gentle physical activity program

- Heart Foundation Walking Groups – free community-based walking network
- FoodCENTS – learn how to create healthy eating options on a budget
- Aboriginal women's exercise group – culturally appropriate exercise for women in Coolbellup

City of Cockburn staff enjoyed the opportunity to get outside and get dirty while helping the environment at Bibra Lake during the annual Corporate Planting Day on 25 August.

The group of 16 eager participants planted 200 local wetland species including Paperbarks and Swan River Myrtle.

Bibra Lake is a wetland of international significance with several species of migratory birds visiting throughout the year. It is also home to threatened species such as the Rainbow Bee-Eater and Black Cockatoos.

This was the City's fourth annual corporate planting day, organised by the City's Sustainability Committee and Environmental Services teams.

The event aims to raise awareness on the importance of the natural environment within urban areas, and provides staff with an opportunity to help improve biodiversity in Cockburn.

In the past year the City has revegetated five hectares with almost 80,000 tube stock installed.

The revegetation program helps to improve habitat values and bushland condition within the City's conservation reserves.

FAMILY SUPPORT IS HERE TO HELP



Sam isn't sleeping at night. He feels reluctant to go to work and when he is at work he gets palpitations and can't concentrate. Sam says that he doesn't know why this is happening, he doesn't have a problem with work as he knows his job and gets the work done. There have been some changes within the structure of the work place. Sam's finding that he is short tempered at home and his wife has said she has had enough and that he needs to get some help.

Situations like Sam’s are common but there are people who can help. Cockburn Family Support Service is a free community service provided by the City for its residents. The support offered is dependent on the needs of that person or family accessing the service. This may include short-term counselling, advocacy, referrals and information or group programs.

- Beeliam Hub playgroup



FACILITIES MANAGEMENT



Azelia Ley Fire Suppression

In July, an automatic fire suppression system was installed on the roof of the Azelia Ley Homestead. The system, which automatically starts sprinklers as soon as smoke or heat is detected, will provide fire protection to the building and reduce the possibility of damage in the event of a bushfire until the Fire Brigade arrives. The system is fed by rainwater, which is collected from gutters on the adjacent shed and stored in a 55,000 litre tank.

Naval Base Solar Lights

12 LED solar lights have been installed at the Naval Base Holiday Park. The lights have inbuilt motion sensors that activate when dark, and increase from 8 to 15 watts when detecting movement. The lights will assist pedestrians walking through the park, especially after dark when using toilet blocks.

If not, you should contact the City immediately as the due date for payment was 28 August 2015, unless you are a senior or pensioner. If you have chosen to pay your rates by the instalment option, then you should have received your reminder notice as the next instalment is due on 30 October 2015.

If you have not elected to pay your rates by instalments and your account is still outstanding, then you will need to call the City to discuss a special payment arrangement as penalty interest will be accruing on overdue accounts and debt recovery may commence.

In order to receive rebates, seniors and pensioners must pay their current rates by mid-June 2016.

Pensioners are encouraged to utilise the free 'Centrepay' option where fortnightly deductions can be made from their pension payment and paid directly to the City. Please contact Centrelink or the City to complete an application form.

If you have an investment property, please keep your notice in a safe place as a fee of \$20 may apply for replacement copies.

IN-HOME CHILDCARE SERVICE AND CAREER OPPORTUNITIES



The City of Cockburn is the approved provider of an In-Home Child Care (IHC) Service, whereby a registered IHC Educator can provide care within the child's family home.

IHC was established to meet the needs of families who are not able to find suitable childcare and who meet specific Commonwealth criteria; three or more children under the age of pre-primary, a child or parent who has a disability or illness or the parents work outside of usual business hours.

This service is supported by a team of professional staff and Commonwealth childcare subsidies are available for eligible families. There are currently 30 IHC Educators operating with the City of Cockburn.


Because IHC services are being sought out by a growing number of families, the City is seeking expressions of interest from applicants who have an understanding of child development, are experienced in the care of children, have a willingness to learn and an enthusiasm to work with young children.
