

Amalgamations – Community Consultation

The City of Cockburn is seeking community input on possible options for Local Government Reform including amalgamation.

Recently the Minister for Local Government, the Hon. John Castrilli announced Local Government Reforms are to take place in Western Australia. The Minister has set a deadline of August 2009 for submissions from all of WA's 139 Councils identifying opportunities for greater sustainability including feedback from the local community on Local Government reform.

The City of Cockburn is a sustainable and growing Council, however it is still required to participate in the reform process, extensively consult our community and use feedback from the community to guide the decision making process including consideration to explore potential rationalisation of resource sharing and improved service delivery. A report prepared by officers of the City is expected to go to the August 13th Ordinary Council Meeting.

The City has taken into account the Guiding Principles for Reform set out by the Local Government Advisory Board (LGAB) and the findings of the West Australian Local Government Association's (WALGA) Systematic Sustainability Study. For more information please visit; www.walga.asn.au/ss

Residential Greenwaste Collection

A reminder to all residents that a greenwaste collection will commence on 6th July 2009 so please make sure your green waste is placed on the verge ready for collection by the below dates.

An information leaflet will be delivered, with your junk mail, 10-14 days before your area collection commences.

Greenwaste items include tree branches, prunings and palm fronds and trunks cut to size.

Waste placed on the verge more than 10 days before your area collection is due to commence is 'illegally dumped' and could result in a fine.

Infill Sewerage Program Delay

On May 15, 2009, the Water Corporation advised that the State's Infill Sewerage Program has been deferred until further notice.

The State Government Budget Papers presented through Parliament on 13 May 2009 specifically quote the following:

"Due to current global financial circumstances, the Infill Sewerage Program has been deferred. Considerable progress has been made in delivering this program to-date, and the remaining work will be reconsidered once the current financial environment improves."

The decision affects areas of Spearwood, Hamilton Hill and Coogee. Works already underway to eastern parts of Spearwood will be completed in accordance with contractual commitments already made.

The City of Cockburn considers the decision to defer these important works to be disappointing and Cockburn Council will continue to lobby the State Government to ensure these works are completed.

3. COC amalgamates with Fremantle and East Fremantle
4. COC amalgamates with Kwinana
5. COC amalgamates with Kwinana, Fremantle and East Fremantle
6. COC amalgamates with Melville

City of Cockburn Budget 2009- 2010



Despite facing large increases in utility costs and State Government fees, the City has passed on a 3% rate increase to residents, making it one of the lowest charging local governments in the Perth metropolitan.

The City's conservative 2009-10 budget delivers on community infrastructure and sees substantial funds invested into major projects including:

- \$2.9 million allocated to the development of the Aubin Grove Sport and Recreation Centre
- \$4.5 million allocated to Success Regional Sporting and Community Complex (in addition to the \$5 million in funding pledged from the previous budget)
- \$4.5 million allocated to the upgrades to the Coolbellup Community Hub including the establishment of new office space, upgrades to the Coolbellup library and car park
- \$1.8 million allocated towards the funding of the Regional SurfLifesaving Facility to be established at Poore Grove
- \$4 million invested into the development of a library at the Lot 7 project at Cockburn Central

The budget also sees:

- \$1.4 million allocated to the development and maintenance of public parks
- \$1.3 million allocated to the development and maintenance of bicycle and footpaths
- \$4.7 million allocated to roadworks, including the establishment of a dual carriageway at Spearwood Avenue
- \$1 million allocated to the initiate stages of the Bibra Lake Management Plan, including conservation works and upgrades to facilities
- The continued purchase of green power for street lighting and community facilities

State Budget delivers mixed news for the City of Cockburn

The Liberal-National Government's first State Budget 2009-10 brought down on May 14 has delivered a range of outcomes for local governments across the State.

There have been some highlights in the new State Budget for the City of Cockburn but overall the City is disappointed in the budget due to the increase in expenses that will affect both Council and its residents.

State Budget 2009-10 highlights for the City of Cockburn:

- The FESA relocation project will go ahead at Cockburn Central (\$29.7M for first phase).
- Over 500 extra car parking bays will be built at Cockburn Central train station.
- New Aubin Grove Primary School (\$15M, 2011)
- Second Stage of Atwell College (\$33M, 2012)
- Additional road funding

State Budget 2009-10 downfalls for the City of Cockburn:

- The FESA Levy will increase between 5-8%, well ahead of headline inflation.
- The Landfill Levy will increase by 350% (from approx \$8 to \$28 per tonne). This is expected to add over \$700,000 to the cost of providing a waste service to the community.
- Amendment to Legislation – The State Government will amend the current Waste legislation to stipulate that the money it receives from the Waste Levy can now be spent on whatever it wants; not necessarily on waste.
- Electricity will increase by approx 30%, which will cost the City approx \$500,000 per year extra for street lighting and lighting the community buildings, parks, public toilets and aged care facilities.
- The cost of water will also increase by approx 10%.





Cockburn Seniors Centre Opens

The Cockburn Seniors Centre will be open to the public from August 1, creating a haven for social activities, workshops and services catering for Cockburn's senior population.

The Centre, at the former Civic Centre site, adjacent to the City's administration offices, will include hairdressing and podiatry services, meeting rooms, recreation areas and a fully equipped kitchen.

Why build the Centre?

The City recognised the need to provide a facility to promote active ageing, senior's wellbeing and social participation. The Centre is centrally located in Cockburn and is accessible by public transport. The City engaged with the Cockburn Regional Seniors Group on the design and facilities to be included in the Centre.

What programs and activities will the Centre host?

The centre will host a broad range of activities and services including: recreational, cultural, fitness and educational programs. The City recently joined with the

Southern Cross Care WA on the Be Active, Live Longer (BALL) program.

Do you have to be a member?

In order to utilise the Centre you must become a member or pay a casual user fee. Membership is open to Cockburn residents and ratepayers 50 years and older.

Where can I find out more?

Come along to the Seniors Centre Open Day on Saturday, August 1 from 9am to 4pm or give Paul Hogan, Seniors Centre Coordinator a call on 9411 3444.

The Community open day will include presentations and workshops as well as an opportunity for residents and ratepayers to view the Centre, join as members and provide input into future programs and events.

Zoning plan approved for Phoenix Revitalisation

The Cockburn Council has moved forward with a major revitalisation of the Phoenix Central area, approving the strategy document, including zoning plans at its May Council meeting.

The approval came after months of community consultation with a recent focus on proposed zoning for residential areas surrounding the hub being changed from the current R20 zoning to R30.

Changes will now be made to City of Cockburn Town Planning Scheme No. 3 will commence in order to implement the zoning changes recommended by the Revitalisation Strategy.

The Strategy proposes revitalisation of the area and includes the creation of a new community hub, a café street, life learning centre and a town park. It affects the Phoenix Town Centre area, including parts of Spearwood and Hamilton Hill.

Dual use path at South Beach reinstated

A joint initiative of Stockland, City of Cockburn and LandCorp, the dual use pathway was reinstated as part of the North Coogee Foreshore Works and Dune Rehabilitation Program which will rejuvenate this section of the Cockburn Coast.

The program of works involved a general clean-up of the area, re-establishment of the native dune form, creation of beach access tracks and construction of the new dual use path reconnecting the South Beach and Rollinson Road car parks.

Works will continue on site with the three month landscaping program scheduled to commence in June 2009 or after the commencement of the normal winter rainfall patterns. The winter months providing the most optimum time for planting.






