



new management plan for bibra lake



Bibra Lake is set to become the most prominent environmental and recreational wetland area south of the river.

The City is currently in the process of developing a draft landscape, recreation and environmental management plan for Bibra Lake, to help further conserve our precious wetland and improve its surrounding facilities including playground and picnic areas.

The draft management plan is being prepared by environmental consulting firm Strategen, with assistance from landscape architects Plan-E.

Strategen Senior Consultant Dan Huxtable said this plan would provide the framework for protecting the important environmental and cultural values of the lake and its surrounds, whilst exploring the full range of recreational experiences the site could offer.

"There is enormous scope for broadening the ways in which people can appreciate and enjoy Bibra Lake and the plan will provide the basis for this," he said.

A draft plan is scheduled to be released for public comment in June 2008.



new boat facilities for woodman point

Cockburn Mayor Stephen Lee has applauded Alannah MacTiernan's announcement to upgrade the boating facilities at Woodman Point.

The upgrade will comprise four new public boat ramps and boat stacking capacity for more than 300 vessels.

As well as eight boat ramp lanes, a service jetty and the boat stacker, the harbour will offer more than 350 car/trailer bays and additional public car parking.

Cockburn Mayor Stephen Lee said he was very pleased that the project would soon be underway.

"It is exciting to see the fantastic upgrades planned for these facilities, which will hopefully get underway by the middle of this year."

Future plans being considered for the precinct include the development of boating-related retail space and industrial areas, and possibly the addition of boat pens.

city of cockburn libraries tackle literacy

A recent Adult Literacy and Life Skills survey from the Australian Bureau of Statistics shows that just over half (54%) of Australians aged 15 to 74 years have the prose literacy skills (e.g. ability to read newspapers) needed to meet the complex demands of everyday life and work. The result for document literacy skills (e.g. ability to use bus timetables) was 53% and numeracy with 47% achieving this level.

The City of Cockburn Libraries are actively working in partnership with Read Write Now to make a difference to the literacy outcomes of adult Western Australians. Read Write Now has been established for over 30 years and is a non-profit organisation with over 700 volunteer tutors throughout Western Australia.

The City of Cockburn Libraries are providing facilities to assist the Fremantle Region of Read Write Now by providing a private space at Coolbellup and Spearwood Libraries for tutoring and for conducting tutor and student interviews. Spearwood Library also hosts quarterly tutor workshops.
