Western Australia needs a new multi-purpose sports stadium. With the AFL finals just finished and the recent Wallabies test in Perth it has become increasingly obvious to everyone that the sporting needs of the West Australian public are not being met by Subiaco Oval.

The only solution is to build a new stadium that can accommodate all sports. Imagine a state of the art facility where you could watch your favourite sports 365 days a year in comfort with over 60,000 other fans. joint fund beats insurance woes

While spiralling public liability insurance costs have crippled many non-profit and community volunteer groups in WA, an innovative partnership between the City of Cockburn and Alcoa has enabled 14 local groups to put the community back into their events.

This follows an agreement between the City of Cockburn and Alcoa to pay their public liability insurance for 12 months - and also support a project to help the groups raise sufficient funds to cover future premiums.

Exorbitant insurance premiums had threatened the ability of local volunteer groups - ranging from pensioner to sporting clubs - to conduct traditional fund-raising events like sausage sizzles and cake stalls.

Alcoa and Cockburn have donated \$60,000 to various groups in the Cockburn Community Development Strategy. The Regional Community Development Group received \$16,500 from this grant to cover insurance costs for Residents Groups.

Thanks to the support of the City and Alcoa, the residents groups are ready for action and much closer to reaching their goals!

food safety travel tips



With the holidays coming up, National Food Safety Week (6-12 November) is focusing on how to keep food safe when travelling. You can avoid picking up nasty stomach bugs by using these tips when eating on the move:

taking your food home

- Try your best to take your food home in the airconditioned part of the car in hot weather, instead of your boot.
- Get home as quickly as possible don't leave shopping in the car.
- If you are travelling for more than 30 minutes, place your cold foods in an insulated container on the way home.
- When you arrive home, immediately pack chilled and frozen products in your fridge or freezer.

tips for camping

- Don't take perishable foods camping unless you have access to a refrigerator. It is best to use dry, UHT and canned products. This will avoid any invading bacteria.
- · As soon as you arrive, put your cooler in a shady area.
- Never save leftovers. Only cook enough for your meal and discard the rest.
- Washing hands after going to the toilet is just as important when camping as it is at home. Use disposable wipes where necessary.

Wally Hagan 10th October 1917 - 21st August 2005

A tribute to the life of Wally Hagan is a tribute to this city. Wally lived and worked in Cockburn since 1923 and was a dedicated member of the community. His tireless work for the people of Cockburn and the development of the city is a priceless gift, and a timeless contribution to our history.

The contributions of one man include serving in WWII, and as a councillor for Cockburn for 25 years. Wally also devoted 25 years to the Junior Football Association, and contributed to the Red Cross and the RSL Club. One of his aims as councillor was to help raise funds for a basketball stadium, which was later named in his honour.

In 1977 Wally received the award for Citizen of the Year, and became a Freeman of our City. HRH Prince Charles presented him with the order of Australia Medal in 1983.

Wally died on the 21st August 2005 at Hillcrest Nursing Home aged 87 years. Ray Lees, former Mayor of Cockburn said, "Nobody ever had a bad word about Wally. He was always there to help no matter what time of the day you asked him, and always showed concern for the people."

Rod Brown, former CEO of the City of Cockburn, feels privileged to have worked with Wally: "He was a fantastic representative and tireless worker for the City of Cockburn," says Rod. "He was a wonderful man and a great friend who I will always remember."

His devotion to our city does not go unnoticed, so we salute Wally Hagan, Freeman of the City of Cockburn. Rest in peace.





The NEW number to call when reporting a crime is 131 444

This replaces the number on the red fridge magnet distributed in the Cockburn Soundings in August 2004.

131 444 is the number to call in a non-emergency situation.

The call taker will ask you a series of questions and take an incident report, issue you with an incident report number and if necessary, arrange for police to attend. You can also visit your local police station to report a crime.

If you see suspicious or illegal activity, report it immediately. Don't assume someone else will tell the police. Don't even wait to discuss it





later with someone else. Report it every time, at the time on 131 444.

This is an initiative of the WA Police, the City of Cockburn and Neighbourhood Watch.

stop the rot

Cockburn bushlands are increasingly threatened by an invasion of a plant

bacterium called dieback. The bacteria can also affect your gardens if the soil is contaminated. Dieback essentially destroys a plant's root system, affecting its ability to draw up water and nutrients from soil.

The Dieback Working Group recommend some simple safety procedures that ensure this dangerous soil-dwelling disease does not greatly affect the flora in our community.

They recommend that homeowners buy plants from accredited nurseries that follow strict hygiene procedures. This is because the disease can be spread in nurseries where contaminated potting mix is used, or even when homeowners transplant established plants from one garden to another.

With continued fighting and a greater understanding within the community, this environmental disease can be prevented.

spring facts

Spring is a peak time for dieback spread as wet, warm soil is its perfect environment. Here are some simple steps you can take to stop the spread this spring.

- 1. Stay out of quarantined areas
- 2. Don't remove soil or mud around bushland (check shoes and tires)
- 3. Protect your trees with phosphite
- 4. Buy dieback free plants


