

San Cisco to headline 2019 Cockburn Central Community Concert

The Cockburn Central Community Concert is set to dazzle in 2019 with the announcement that home-grown international sensation San Cisco will headline.

"We are very excited to headline the Cockburn Central Community Concert in February! Looking forward to playing at home again", San Cisco band members said.

The four-piece indie/pop outfit rocketed to stardom in 2011 with the launch of their EP Awkward which was voted seventh on Triple J's Hottest 100 Countdown.

The group has since released three albums to critical acclaim both at home and abroad. The band

released their most recent album, *The Water*, in 2017 and embarked on their biggest tour to date – playing 21 shows in 46 days across America, Europe and Australia.

Receiving its world premiere on Triple J, their new single 'When I Dream' is a quintessential breezy upbeat pop jam with hooks that will dance around your head for days.

The members of San Cisco – Jordi Davieson, Josh Biondillo, Scarlett Stevens and Jennifer Aslett – are all local talent hailing from Fremantle.

Submerge your senses

The Coogee Maritime Trail is an underwater display waiting to be discovered. At Coogee Beach, you can explore the Omeo shipwreck, underwater art gallery and artificial reef.

This December marks the Coogee Maritime Trail's third birthday. A diversity of local marine life has joined the party and now calls the trail home. When you dive in this summer make sure you explore the shipwreck, breakwater wall and artificial reefs as they each provide a unique habitat to view.

Local users regularly report sightings of octopus, cuttlefish, sting-rays and the occasional dolphin. -

Regular monitoring of the trail shows that fish communities as well as sea snails, sponges, corals and sea squirts, dominate life on the trail.

What's new on the trail?

New underwater features

Additional artificial reef structures will be installed this summer, helping link the Omeo shipwreck to the rest of the trail, enhance user experience and increase marine biodiversity. Trail features will likely include further reef 'abitat' modules and interpretive signage in shallower waters, and reef matts and reef pyramids (formerly known as temples) installed in approximately 9m of water.

An interactive 'selfie' porthole will also be installed close to the shipwreck for snorkelers and divers to capture underwater memories.

Public ablutions facility, road and car parking

Funding has been allocated for an extension of Napoleon Parade and construction of a new public car park on the south side of the Port Coogee southern peninsular. Subject to agreements being finalised, construction work for the road and car park is expected to commence in early 2019. The City is also commissioning design works for a new public amenities building to be located at the north-western end of the Omeo Park foreshore nearby this new car park (on the Port Coogee southern peninsular). Design is expected to be completed over the next six months and construction is intended to commence in 2019/20.

No fishing zone

Trail buoys

Three marker buoys were installed in October this year. They are intended to make the 'no fishing' and 'no boating' areas around the trail very clear to fishers, trail users and recreational boaters.

Trail position markers

Along the breakwater rock wall, two trail position markers identify the Stella Maris – sea star artwork, and also the reef pyramid. Additional markers will be installed in the future to assist users to navigate the trail more effectively.

Proposed changes to boating areas

The City has been working with relevant authorities and community members to consider the implementation of 'no boating'

zones off areas of C.Y O'Connor Beach and at the Coogee Maritime Trail.

The proposal would have the areas declared closed waters to all vessels by the Department of Transport (DoT). Boats (both power and sail) would be prohibited from entering the areas unless approved by the City or a relevant state authority. This is primarily in the interest of swimmer, snorkeler and diver safety and would align with the existing 'No fishing' zone already in place.

The proposed area for the trail is shown on the map. Lifesaving and maintenance vessels are planned to have exemptions from this prohibition.

Be waste-wise this Christmas



Christmas is traditionally a time for presents, packaging and wrapping which leads to bulging bins! This year, you can join the war on waste by reducing your consumption over the holiday period without losing that festive cheer.

Here are some tips to reduce waste:

• Buy experiences instead of 'things' – spending time with loved ones often means more than presents. Take them out for a movie or a meal, go on an adventure, go on a bushwalk or, if you're brave, try a sky dive!

- When buying gifts, opt for good quality items that will last and only buy things you know they will use. If you're unsure, keep the receipt so they can swap it
- Opt for pre-loved Christmas decorations or make your own
- Swap Christmas cards for a phone call or e-card
- Make your own Christmas tree out of cardboard boxes or pallets which you can use year after year
- Only buy food you know you'll eat and get creative with any leftovers
- Cut down on the disposables try to use real crockery and cutlery where possible. If you can't avoid disposables, opt for compostable options and dispose of them in your general waste bin.

Christmas Waste Collection

We like to give our hardworking waste collection drivers a break over the festive season, which means your bin dates may change. Bins will not be collected on Tuesday 25 December 2018 or Tuesday 1 January 2019. Tuesday to Friday collections during these weeks will be collected a day later than usual.


Your doggy checklist

Online registration renewals

Did you know you can renew your dog's registration online? 1 November was the deadline to ensure your registration is renewed and current. Act now to avoid possible infringements. Rangers can issue on the spot fines if your dog remains unregistered. Go online and complete it today **cockburn.wa.gov.au/dogrego**

Dog waste

While you're out with your dog, do the right thing and pick up after them. We have new compostable dog poo bags that can be disposed of in the bins located within our parks and reserves. Picking up after your pooch helps keep our recreational spaces clean and pristine for everyone to use. Did you know it can take anywhere from two months to a year for dog poo to decompose?

Pool and spa owners

Now that the warmer months are here you may be doing some backyard preparations for those weekends of entertaining the family, kids and their friends.

As a pool or spa owner it is your legal obligation to ensure your swimming area is compliant. When you receive a letter from our Pool Inspectors, ensure you contact your nominated inspector as soon as possible to make an appointment to check that your swimming area is safe for your kids and their friends.

Fences, gates and latches should be checked to ensure they are in good working order. Other things to consider:

• The fence must be at least 1.2m high. Ground levels that rise over time such as garden beds, trees and shrubs can make a fence non-compliant

- The fence must not leave a gap of more than 10cm from the ground level to the bottom of the fence
- There are no gaps of more than 10cm between vertical bars of a fence
- Gates to the pool must be selfclosing and self-latching
- The gate cannot be propped open, this is illegal
- The gate must swing away from the pool to open
- The gate latch must be at least 1.5m from the ground
- 'Non-climbable zones' must be in place and free from objects that can be climbed on to get over the fence, such as furniture, plants and trees
- Any windows that open onto the pool cannot open more than 10cm (screens can be fixed to windows to ensure compliance).



Did you know?

It is a legal requirement to have a safety barrier for anything containing 300mm of water or more. This includes things like blow-up pools or baby paddle pools.
