The City of Cockburn is pleased to announce that its Youth Active Program has won a Heart Foundation Kellogg Local Government Award for the category 'Programs that Improve Heart Health in Priority Groups'.

The City hosted a presentation ceremony on November 14 at Council to celebrate the success of the program with participants, clubs, staff and program stakeholders. The award was presented to the City by the Heart Foundation's chief executive Maurice Swanson.

The City's Youth Active Program has assisted some 300 children since it began in 2005. The aim of the program is to provide assistance for disadvantaged youth to participate in a local club sport. The program is specifically targeted for young people (5-18 yrs) from low-income families who live in Cockburn.

pool blankets arrive at South Lake Leisure Centre

As part of this year's sustainability initiatives, three pool blankets have recently been installed at the South Lake Leisure Centre, which will save a massive 424,800 litres of water per year and a Greenhouse Gas saving of 109 tonnes per year.

calling all primary school teachers...

The City of Cockburn has developed its environmental education initiatives for 2008 and is offering it to all primary school teachers as they prepare for another year.

The environmental initiatives have been grouped into four broad themes:

- Greenhouse Gas
- Biodiversity
- Waterwise
- Liveable Communities

These initiatives have been designed to raise awareness and help educate the students about the environment and ways in which they can contribute to conserving our natural areas.

The City also provides a range of programs and in-class lessons.

All of the environmental initiatives have been carefully developed to achieve the widest range of curriculum learning area outcomes.

There is also sufficient overlap across the programs to enable you to cover a number of different learning outcomes under the one theme, if so desired.

phoenix central revitalisation project update

The Phoenix Central Revitalisation project is now well underway. Before preparing any plans, the City first went to the community for their ideas and input. This was undertaken through the use of a survey to land owners in the study area and through employing a consultant "Village Well" to help conduct a Community Vision Forum, as well as surveying the retailers/traders in the study area.

The City sent 4,268 landowners surveys in the study area. The study area is an approximate 10 minute walk from the Phoenix commercial hub and includes parts of Spearwood and Hamilton Hill.

The survey results show overwhelming support by landowners for the area to be allowed to redevelop and that a significant majority of residents wanted to redevelop their own properties.

The Community Vision Forum also gave the community a chance to express their ideas and concerns. On Saturday, October 27, approximately 150 people from the community spent three hours describing their concerns and aspirations for the future of the area. Some of the key hotspots / issues for improvement identified by the community were:

Traffic

Creating traffic calming and safe pedestrian access along Rockingham Road, Lancaster Street and Coleville Crescent.

The Shopping Centre

Beautifying and landscaping, including better quality food, boutiques and places for the community to meet and spend time.

Council Land

Providing facilities and open space for community use and the proposed Seniors Centre.

Small Traders/Businesses (Near corner of Phoenix & Rockingham roads)

Improving the look and connectivity and increasing family-friendly night time activity.

A more detailed summary of the project and of the community feedback from the landowner surveys and the Community Vision Forum are available from the City's administration office and from the City's website.

The City is now preparing draft plans and options for the area having regard to the community's ideas and concerns. These draft plans will be made available for the community to review hopefully by April next year.

The City wishes to thank all those who filled in surveys and provided input into the process.
