PARENTING SUPPORT

Services and Workshops

Cockburn Early Years is a City of Cockburn service that supports parents with children from pre-birth to eight years old. The service provides information on children’s development, ideas for home learning and play, strategies for setting limits, encouraging a close relationship between parent and child, emotional support and information about pregnancy and early parenthood.

Cockburn Early Years also offers the following:

- Parent and child playgroup
- Parenting groups
- One on one parenting consultations
- Short-term parenting counselling
- Early learning and play information

Parenting Tip

To enhance your child’s self-confidence, try giving them regular and focused attention that is playful, warm and encouraging. Let your child choose a play activity and follow their lead without interruptions and with your full attention. Your child will positively respond to your gentle tone of voice and warm touch. Child safe and secure in Family Day Care

There are currently limited childcare vacancies within the City and across Perth’s southern suburbs.

Family Day Care (FDC) Educators are registered following an extensive selection process and meet high safety and security standards including:

- An ability to provide warm and responsive care leading to the child’s sense of belonging and security
- Qualifications - Diploma or Certificate III ECEC and/ or experienced and working toward qualification
- First Aid (incl. anaphylaxis and asthma), National Police Clearance, Working with Children Check
- The provision of an approved FDC home that is modified and equipped to ensure children’s safety; and
- Compliance with all legislation and service requirements through regular monitoring.

Parents can relax knowing their child is safe and secure. Child care for work and respite is now also available.





SHED PERMITS

Permits for that man cave

Many of us have heard the comment that 'every man needs a shed' but some residents may not realise that a permit is often required before building that special man cave.

The maximum size allowed for a shed in residential areas depends on the size of the property but in general, a shed can be up to 100sqm or cover a maximum of 10 percent of your property, whichever is smaller.

If your shed is 460sqm, then you can build a shed up to 46sqm.

However, if your shed is larger than 10sqm, or the walls are more than 2.4 metres in height, then you will need a building permit prior to installation. If two or more sheds have an aggregate floor area greater than 10sqm, then a building permit will also be required.

Sheds can be built right up to a boundary but can be no closer than 900mm from the associated house eaves. If this cannot be achieved, the shed must be 900mm from the boundary to ensure the maintenance of adequate fire separation.

All shed construction must comply with the provisions of the Building Code of Australia and all other agencies' statutory requirements. The City's planning requirements also need to be adhered to.

ENVIRONMENT AND SUSTAINABILITY

Trial project to improve Yangebup Lake water quality

The City of Cockburn's innovative trial project to address water quality within Yangebup Lake is already showing positive results. A nutrient stripping basin using a solar powered pump was installed at the lake in September 2015, following initial earthworks and weed control.

Yangebup Lake is a wetland covering about 80Ha, and has been an ongoing source of nuisance midge.

More than 19,000 native plants have been installed as part of the project with Apace WA, local schools and community members involved in planting activities.

Positive results include an increased cover of native vegetation and animal activity within the site.

Recent monitoring indicated the nutrient basin is working and it is hoped that improving the water quality will reduce midge in addition to improving the overall health of the wetland.

The project has been part funded by the State Natural Resource Management Office and the City of Cockburn.



HISTORY WITH LEAH

10th Light Horse Brigade

The 10th Light Horse Regiment was the only mounted squadron to be completely made up of West Australians. Formed at the outbreak of WWI in 1914, the men provided their own horses and spent most of the War in the Middle East, before disbanding in 1919.

The Regiment was reformed in 1939 and began training at a camp at Woodman Point, south of the Quarantine Station. The area was ideal for training, close to the sea to swim the horses and contained plenty of scrub and bush for exercises and drills.

Over 600 men and their horses camped there in November 1939, returning in January 1940 for three months' intense training. Most of these men and their horses took trains from their regional home towns in the south-west, arriving at the Spearwood station and walking the rest of the way.

Such a large number of horses swimming in the sea attracted many sharks to the area and on one memorable night fisherman hauled in 24 sharks off the shore of Woodman Point!

The Regiment didn't undertake active service in WWII but were kept as a home defence force, which involved regular training and drills, allowing them to return to their jobs during wartime.



STRATEGIC COMMUNITY PLAN – DRAFT OUT NOW

Following great feedback from across the community, the City has drafted its Strategic Community Plan 2016-2026 and wants to know what you think.

The Draft Plan includes key areas of focus for the City over the next 10 years, including community services, facilities and important issues.

The Strategic Community Plan 2016-2026 will go to Council for adoption in June 2016.

FIXING ARMADALE ROAD CONGESTION

Phase 2 of Community Connect South campaign

The cities of Armadale and Cockburn will be working collaboratively to lobby State and Federal Governments to secure the estimated \$160M in funding required to complete the Community Connect South (CCS) road infrastructure campaign.

Phase 2 of CCS will focus on the proposed new Armadale Road alignment and new bridge over the freeway to connect through to North Lake Road.

This road project is a regional solution.

Congestion issues at Cockburn Central spread beyond peak periods and are creating real barriers to the continued growth and prosperity of the region. The congestion has a flow on effect throughout the Enterprise Arc from Armadale through to Jandakot and Fremantle.

The campaign to complete CCS will feature heavily in the lead up to the next

Federal election, as Armadale Road runs right through the new Federal seat of Burt.

The WA Planning Commission approved a Planning Control Area over the land corridor required for the new road alignment and bridge which is outlined in the Cockburn Central Activity Centre Plan. With Council's adoption of this Plan at its February Council meeting, the City of Cockburn has now removed any regulatory impediment from finishing the CCS campaign.


