seniors shape their city

Cockburn Seniors were given a chance to help shape their city when the first Seniors' Community Action Plan Workshop took place in late June.

Participants braved bad weather to attend the workshop and respond to the City's call for community input. Daniel Hanley, Community Development Coordinator for the City, worked with the seniors to identify what their specific needs and concerns were. They then drafted possible projects to address these issues.

"This process has been incredibly useful for us," said Mr Hanley. "We now know where to focus our energies when we are working with our seniors."

There was overwhelming interest in improving social opportunities and facilities for seniors, followed by concern for environmental issues.

The second workshop on July 21st dealt with practical planning for the various project ideas to help get them off the ground.

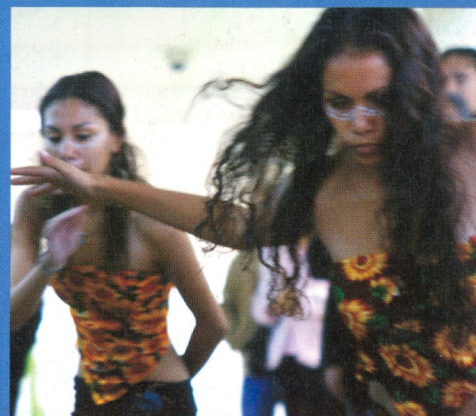
indigenous culture celebrated

The Aboriginal flag was raised in a ceremony marking the start of National NAIDOC Week on June 30th. NAIDOC Week celebrates the survival of Indigenous culture and the Indigenous contribution to modern Australia.

Participants listened to stirring words from local elder Rev. Sealin Garlett, Hamilton Hill Senior High School students and Mayor Stephen Lee. The beautiful Dindima dancers had the crowd captivated and presented the Mayor and CEO Stephen Cain with symbolic branches at the end of their performance.

Mayor Lee said that NAIDOC was not a celebration just for Indigenous Australians, but an opportunity for all Australians to appreciate our country's rich indigenous heritage. "We need to see NAIDOC Week as an opportunity to get together and learn from each other's cultures," he said, before joining participants for a snack of kangaroo, emu, damper and bush chutneys.

Other NAIDOC activities included a Seniors Lunch Dance jointly held with the City of Melville and a hip hop night for the youngsters.

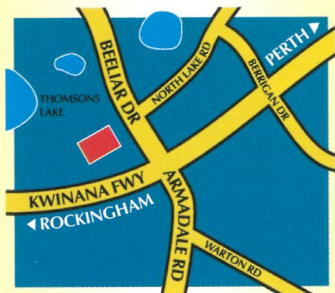

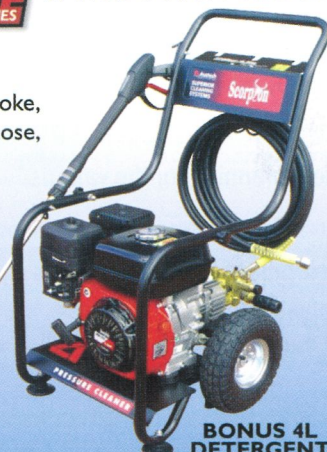

The Port Coogee development has been given the green light by the Supreme Court. This \$500 million project will be the centrepiece of development on our Cockburn Coast, generating jobs and creating a world-class facility that we can all be proud of.

Further north at South Beach the first blocks have gone on sale. I recently inspected the display homes being built on the site and was impressed by the potential of this development.

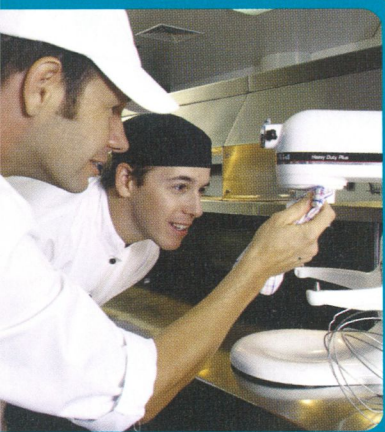

BRAG news

The Beeliar Residents Action Group has much to be proud of, with their successful nesting box project well underway.

Assisted by the Jandakot Lions, BRAG placed 39 nesting boxes in trees around Beeliar. Now residents can observe wildlife nesting, while learning to assist, protect and co-exist with their natural neighbours. BRAG have been working with students from Beeliar Primary School, who have "adopted" nest boxes and are studying the wonderful wildlife of the Beeliar habitats. Signs have also been erected to tell people about the project.

This was the first initiative of the BRAG Environmental Committee, who are now busy building a walkway and picnic area in the Beeliar Regional Park. The picnic area will form part of an entrance to the walkway, which will run across the park between the Kogolup lakes, joining up with a pathway on the eastern side at Hammond Road. Challenger TAFE are helping with the design and building of the picnic area and path and the Department of Conservation and Land Management are helping with funds and staff. Cockburn Cement very kindly donated the limestone, which was recently used to prepare the area for the picnic tables.

Ron Kimber of BRAG hopes that they can share some of their love for Beeliar through these projects. "We want to give people a chance to appreciate the native plants and animals of the area," says Ron, "and ultimately our projects will give residents a greater sense of ownership of their natural environment."

The success of BRAG's environmental projects will see it nominated for the 2005 WA Environment Awards.

don't bin it BOX IT!

Did you know that last year Australians used more than 18 million printer cartridges, and most of these would have gone straight into landfill without any form of recycling or reuse?

Now you can recycle your printer cartridges thanks to a partnership with Planet Ark. There are a number of special boxes located in Cockburn where you can drop off your used cartridges. The City has set the example by making use of the recycling program within its own offices and invites residents to use the boxes situated at Spearwood, Coolbellup and Success libraries as well as at the City's administration building at Coleville Crescent, Spearwood.

Petra Zele, the City's Environmental Education Officer, said that the Planet Ark program was impressive in that it recycles absolutely all the components in printer cartridges. "All of the recovered component materials, including aluminium, steel, plastic, toner, ink and foam are recycled into new products or reused in new applications," she said.

what to do if you find a syringe



Sometimes syringes and needles are carelessly thrown away instead of being put in proper disposal boxes. We all know this is dangerous, so what do you do if you find one? Captain Cleanup says that if you want to call an adult, you should first find something big like a brick to put over the syringe. This will stop anyone else falling on it and help you find it again when you come back.

The most important thing is not to panic. Get a container with a lid, like a plastic drink bottle and take it to the syringe (not the other way round!). Pick up the used syringe by the blunt end and don't touch the sharp end. If the plastic cover has fallen off the needle, don't try to put it back.

Then, put the needle and syringe into the container point first. More than one can be placed in the container but don't overfill it. Make sure the container is tightly sealed and put it in a green domestic rubbish bin. Do not put needles and syringes down toilets or drains.

Next time you see a syringe on the ground, remember to keep your cool and help keep our community safe.

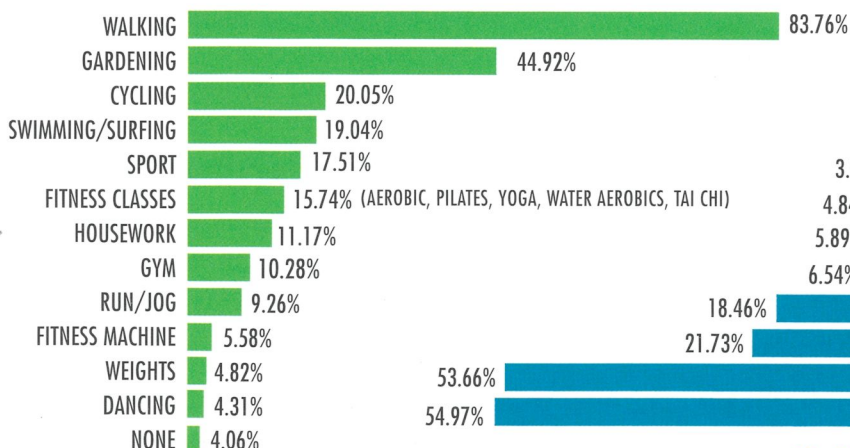

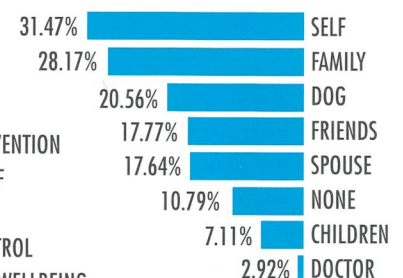
activity survey results

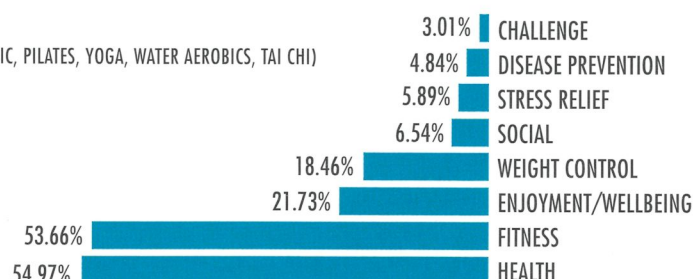
reasons for physical activity

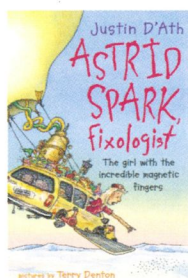
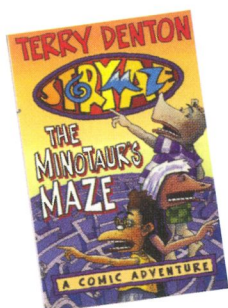

Want to raise your heart rate and some funds at the same time? The Bibra Lake Fun Run can help you do both! This Cockburn Classic Event is held every year on the third Sunday in September, this year being the 18th September. If you belong to a sporting, community or school group, this is the fundraising opportunity for you.

The Bibra Lake Fun Run is a 6 kilometre course around Bibra Lake on the dual-use footpath and a small section of parkland. It is open to all types of competitors including runners, walkers, dogs and babies in prams.

The cost to enter is \$5 per runner. All prepaid runners are able to enter under the umbrella of a sporting, community or school group. After the event, half of the entry fees entered under the group or school name are reimbursed to that group (i.e. \$2.50 per runner).

There are no restrictions on who may enter under a group's name - this may include family members, friends and pets. As an added benefit, the group that has the greatest number of entrants also receives a bonus of \$250! Last year Bibra Lake Primary School had the most runners and made \$292.50.

The fun run is organised by the Cockburn Recreation Advisory Committee and the City of Cockburn.

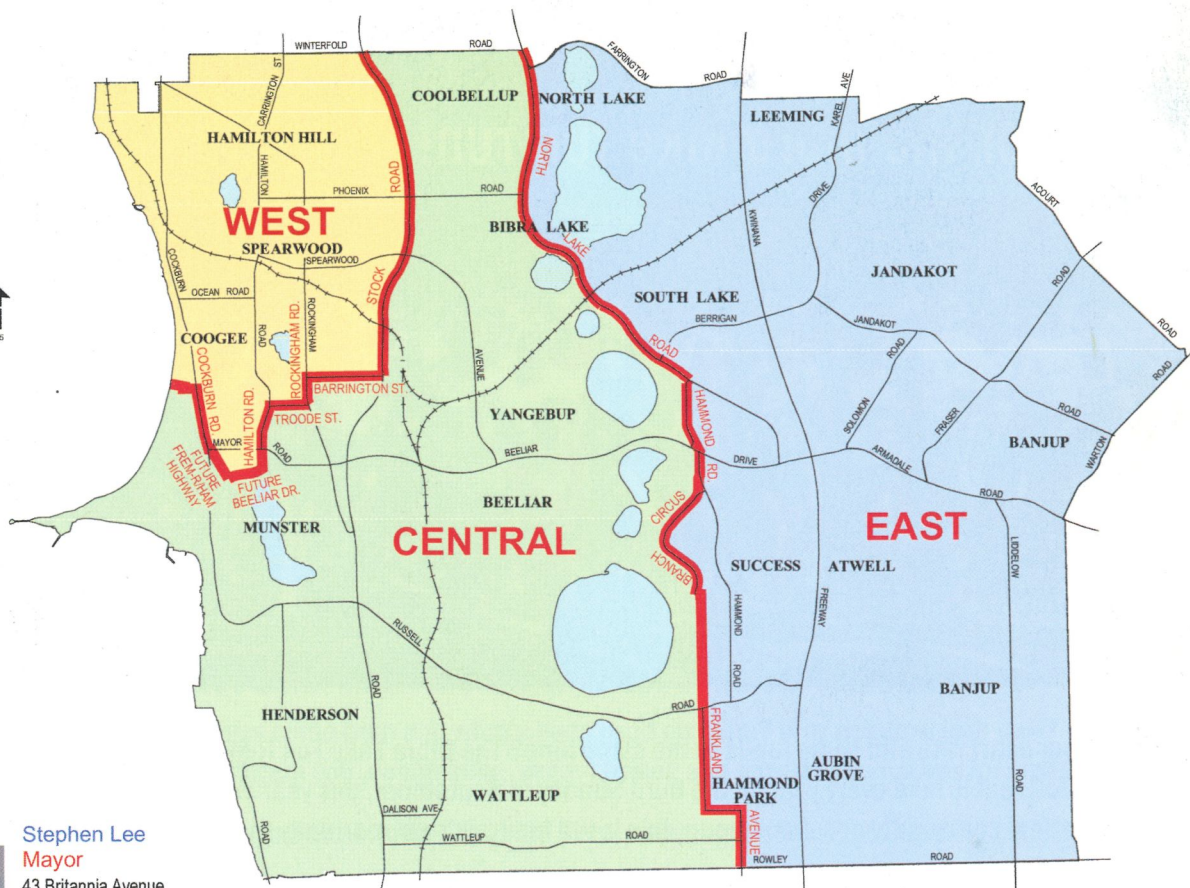
change in pool inspection process

The City of Cockburn would like to advise ratepayers with swimming pools and/or spas that the inspection program is set to change in 2005/2006. Until now we were inspecting swimming pools once every fourth year and charging once within that same year. The new method will be an ongoing one where all pool owners will be charged \$13.75 every year to cover the cost of their pool/spa inspection. This inspection will be carried out by an officer at least once over the course of four years.

Have you removed your pool or spa since it was last inspected?

If you have, it would be wise to advise the City's Building Service without delay. The City will soon be determining which properties need to be charged the \$13.75 swimming pool inspection levy. If your property is on our records as having a pool or spa, a charge of \$13.75 will be allocated to your property.

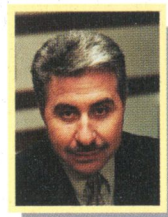

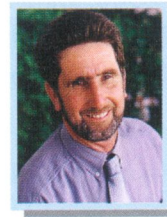

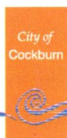
