

## Fantastic new facilities at Bibra Lake



Families will just love the brand new playground, barbecue shelter and table seating which have been installed on the western foreshore of Bibra Lake.

Six additional kilometres of dual use path have also been constructed, which means that there are now significant stretches of pathway suitable for leisurely use and for those travelling at high speeds.

The adjacent Cockburn Cruiser playground has also received a full upgrade and a new toilet block will be installed next year to replace the old one.

Implementation of the multi-million dollar Bibra Lake Landscape, Recreational and Environmental Management Plan is continuing. A total of 13 Million will be spent over 9 years with an estimated 1.6 Million spent in 2009/10 on landscaping, recreational and environmental enhancements.

Forthcoming priorities include new boardwalks and bird hide, new walkways, interpretive and information sign installations, and continued protection and enhancement of the natural environment.

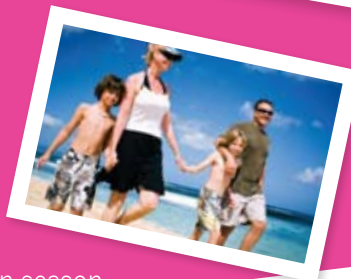

## City scores trifecta at planning awards



The City of Cockburn was recognised at the annual Planning Institute of Australia (WA Division) Awards for Planning Excellence late last year, scoring honours in three categories.

The Phoenix Revitalisation Strategy received the State President's Award and a certificate of commendation while the city's online planning system was given an Award for Excellence.

Providing a strategic framework for the Phoenix Town Centre, including the surrounding suburbs of Spearwood and Hamilton Hill, the award-winning strategy aims to create a central community hub for Cockburn.

The online planning system was introduced to the City of Cockburn website to make it easier for developers and landowners to track the progress of their development applications.

"These awards recognise Cockburn's commitment to innovative development that is suitable and beneficial to the area, while also acknowledging we are doing our best to make life simple and more convenient for people wanting to lodge a development application within the city," said Director of Planning, Daniel Arndt.

## A smarter way to travel

City of Cockburn employees are taking steps to find better ways to commute to and from work since the City adopted the TravelSmart Workplace program in December 2009.

A joint initiative of the Department of Environment and Conservation (DEC) and the Department of Transport, the program helps Perth workplaces to develop travel plans to reduce car use and encourage the use of sustainable transport options such as public transport, walking, cycling and carpooling.

The City recently acquired bicycles from the Henderson Landfill Recycle Shop for staff to use to go to meetings. They have developed a car pooling register and corporate SmartRiders will be introduced in the future.

DEC TravelSmart Workplace Coordinator Amy Thom said, "If people caught public transport just one day a week, carpooled, or walked or cycled to work instead of driving, it is estimated that vehicle emissions could be reduced by 20 per cent."



## Cockburn wins award for tobacco plan

The City of Cockburn's Tobacco Action Plan won the National Tobacco Category Award in the 2009 Heart Foundation Local Government Awards.

The Heart Foundation judging panel was impressed to see that both a Smoke-Free Council and Environment Policy have been adopted, so residents and visitors can now enjoy smoke-free playgrounds, council buildings, bus stops and events.

Other initiatives in the project include education, publicity and signage, plus stop smoking courses for staff and the public.

The Plan was supported by South Metropolitan Public Health Unit.

### Summer tips

Water heating accounts for 30% of the energy used in a typical WA household, so this is a good area to concentrate on to make big savings. Here are some easy actions you can do to save power and money:

1. Turn your hot water unit down. Storage units must be set to a minimum of 60°C but instantaneous units can be set between 40 and 50°C;
2. Install a water-saving shower head .
3. Don't use the hot water tap for small amounts of water.

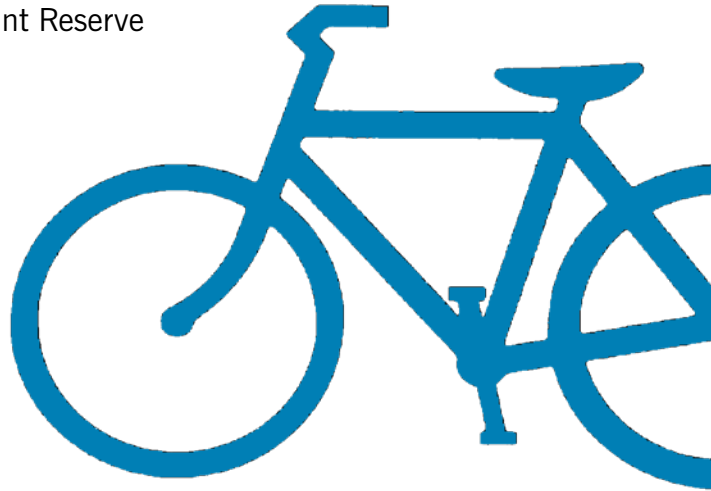

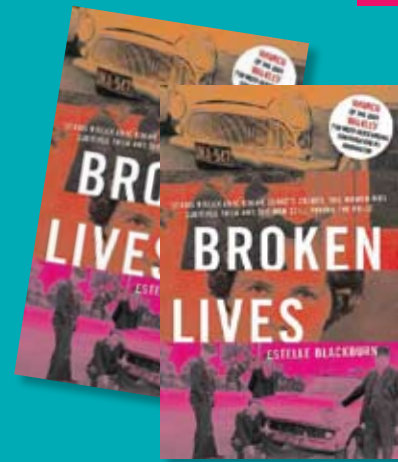
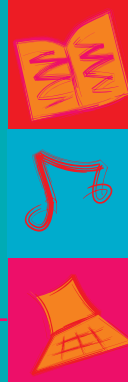

"Challenger TAFE was very open to suggestions about

how the program should be tailored," he said. "The structure of the workshops meant our managers could study while working, resulting in limited disruption to their personal lives.

Challenger TAFE Business Program Manager Rowena Maling said the training was delivered in the form of on-site workshops, tailored to meet the needs of the council.



## Green fingered students get gardening

Congratulations to the parents and staff of South Coogee and Phoenix Primary Schools who worked extremely hard to create two beautiful new school gardens.

Students at South Coogee Primary School have created native garden plots at the centre of the school. Each student was involved in the planting and is now responsible for caring for allocated plants.

Phoenix Pre-Primary has rejuvenated their grounds with native plants, a veggie patch and a herb garden.

Kath Merrick, Garden Coordinator at Phoenix Primary said the kids loved getting their hands dirty, learning about local native plants, watering the gardens (from the new rainwater tanks), looking for worms, watching their seeds turn into lush veggies, and eating the fruits of their labour.

# Grants, donations and sponsorship funding opportunities

## Applications now open

Applications are now open for the following funding opportunities to support local groups, organisations and individuals for a wide variety of activities and services:

**Community Grants** assist local community groups and organisations to provide projects or activities that benefit residents of Cockburn. Applications are to a maximum of \$15,000, with smaller amounts encouraged.

**Sustainable Events Grants** assist local community groups and organisations in the provision of ongoing programs and activities for the benefit of the residents of Cockburn. The maximum grant provided to any one group will be \$7,000, over a four-year period.

**Donations** are available to provide financial assistance towards the day-to-day running costs of not-for-profit groups, not for a specific project or activity. Donations are limited and highly competitive.

**Sponsorship** is a mutually beneficial partnership arrangement where the City of Cockburn makes a financial contribution to a group, organisation or individual for a specific purpose, project, activity or event and, in return, the City receives public recognition for its contribution. The maximum is \$20,000 for organisations and \$2,000 for individuals.

**Cultural Grants** support local arts and cultural activities. Applications to a maximum of \$4,000, with smaller amounts encouraged.

**Youth Art Scholarships** (under 18) are available for those who live in Cockburn and are either doing further study or travelling in relation to their art. These scholarships are to a maximum of \$500 to assist with fees, materials or travel costs.

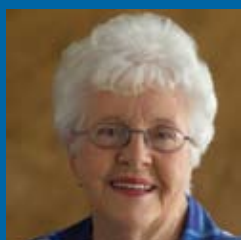

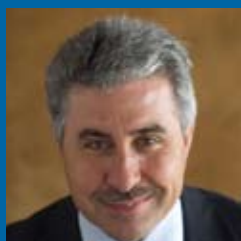
