NEW LIBRARY FOR COCKBURN

Monday 19 March 2001 saw virtually everything in place for a well attended opening by Mayor Stephen Lee of the City's new library service, Success Public library.

Success Library is a shopfront service situated within the Gateways Shopping Centre at Success. It occupies a small area of 104 square metres, so is only able to hold a collection of about 4000 items. However this does not stop it being an important window on, and point of contact with, the rest of the Public Library & Information Service.

Because of its unique and indeed unusual situation, particular emphasis is being placed on the provision of six public access computer terminals. Most of these are dedicated to providing free Internet access for the public. The others provide a virtual library service, whereby users can browse the catalogue and place requests via the computer for items in the stock of other branches. No form filling in is necessary.

Its immediate popularity can be seen from the fact that it has been visited by an average of over 300 people each day. In its first week 330 new members were enrolled, 80 of whom were registered on the first day.

All this along with getting used to working close to shopping centre hours, has kept the staff of Samantha Hughes, librarian; Lawley Yukich, library technician and Coral Petkovich, Jill Watson and Teresa Federico, library and one or two other temporary helpers well and truly on their toes.

It seems that the combination of long hours (9.15am until the shopping centre closes), every day opening and the emphasis on children and technology, will ensure its future as a vital asset for the surrounding communities.









Having Trouble Paying Your Rates?

The due date, 20 March 2001, has now passed for the fourth instalment of Council's Rates. Ratepayers are urged to contact the Council's Rates Department if they are unable to meet this final payment. Regional Recycling Initiative


The City of Cockburn, together with the Cities of Canning, Melville, Fremantle, and the Town of East Fremantle, have combined our resources under the guidance of the Southern Metropolitan Regional Council, to provide the first stage of a unique Resource Recovery project.

Over the next few months, Cockburn residents will receive a new 240 L Recycling 'wheelie' bin. The distinctive yellow topped bin is provided for the collection of recyclables from our waste stream and subsequently to optimise the diversion of these materials from the landfill.

An information pack detailing how you can contribute and benefit from this service will be delivered separately to your letterbox, prior to the commencement date on 28 May 2001.

City of Cockburn Waste Services seek your co-operation in waiting for this information pack before using your new Recycling bin, to avoid possible contamination and servicing problems. The recycling bin will NOT be emptied until after 28 May 2001.

A Big Cheque for a Big Day



A big cheque for a big day...on Tuesday 3 April 2001, the Hon. Dr Geoff Gallop, Premier of Western Australia, came to the Council Chambers and presented the City with a check for \$662,687. As Council staff and Cockburn residents exploded party poppers and unfurled streamers, Dr Gallop handed an oversized cheque to Cockburn Mayor Stephen Lee.

The money returned was part of the almost \$1.7 million bill for the cost of the Douglas Inquiry. The previous State Government demanded that the City repay this cost. According to Mayor Lee this would have led to a seven per cent hike for Cockburn ratepayers. The \$662,687 was the first payment on that debt made by Council last year. During the recent State election, Dr Gallop promised that if Labour won the election the State Government would pay the cost and the first payment would be returned.

"Of all the other Inquiries conducted, Cockburn is the first council that has ever been asked to pay," said Dr Gallop. "We believed it was a situation that was unfair and unjust and definitely one that should be remedied."

WA Municipal Association President Ian Mickel congratulated the State Government on returning the money. "Not only has the Premier corrected the actions of the previous State Government, but he has clearly identified the funding responsibilities of the State and Local Governments in Inquiries of this nature," Cr. Mickel said.

At the celebration were Dr Gallop's Labor colleagues, Cockburn MLA Fran Logan and Southern River MLA Paul Andrews. Also taking part in the festivities were Cockburn Councillors, representatives from various community groups and Council staff. After the presentation, the Premier stayed and enjoyed some of the City's hospitality and chatted with the other guests.

Crime and Safety

According to surveys undertaken by Council, crime and safety are important issues facing us in Cockburn. The Cockburn Police Station has a team of twenty officers that are dedicated to reducing crime and assisting the public. The staff consists of customer service, crime prevention and aboriginal liaison officers.

The station is open for business from Monday to Friday, except public holídays, between 8am and 4pm. The station's phone number is 9418 2409, fax 9434 3557. Police are on duty for twenty-three hours each day patrolling or attending tasks in this area. Staff from other areas i.e. traffic, Fremantle Independent Patrol Group, detectives and air wing, also patrol our area.

Fremantle detectives assist our local staff by inquiring into the more serious offences. Mounted horse patrols are also utilised for all suburbs.

Are you wondering how all these different departments and units work together to make our community a safer place? Here is one example; recently Cockburn Police received information from a member of the public about what appeared to be a burglary on a factory unit in Yangebup. Cockburn Police attended and found that the offenders had forced open a roller door to this unit and found cannabis growing inside. The offenders then stole some of these plants.

Fremantle detectives and Cockburn police conducted inquiries and found inside this unit in excess of 500 cannabis plants being grown in a hydrophonic hot house factory.

As a result of inquiries Fremantle detectives have two people have been charged with cultivate cannabis with intent to sell and supply. Currently they are both in the court system on this charge.



That is an example of how the police work to solve crimes in the district. According to Cockburn's Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator, Stan Cole, there are some simple things all of us can do to prevent crime. Offences of stealing and burglary may be curtailed by ensuring that your home is well and truly locked, even when you are at home. Do not leave property where a potential offender may remove it. When shopping, keep your car locked and the keys in your pocket. Do not leave keys openly displayed in your home, hide them. From an offenders point of view it is easier to steal car keys than attempt to disarm an immobiliser.

Volunteer Walk of Fame

The United National General Assembly has declared 2001 to be the International Year of Volunteers. This has resulted in over one hundred countries agreeing to acknowledge the critical role played by volunteers with public celebrations. In Cockburn, Council will be honouring local volunteer groups with a Volunteers Walk of Fame. The project aims to acknowledge and celebrate the contribution volunteers make to our community. Located at the Coogee Jetty, the Walk of Fame will consist of plaques commemorating the many volunteer groups within the City.

Volunteers make a significant impact on Cockburn. It is estimated that one person in every five aged fifteen years and over is a volunteer of some kind. This contribution equals over 7 million hours of unpaid work, with each volunteer averaging 3.2 hours per week. In monetary terms the contribution to the City by volunteers equals \$108 million per year. Of course volunteers are not in it for the money. Almost two thirds of volunteers say personal satisfaction is the key motivator for volunteering.

The City of Cockburn will be launching the Volunteer Walk of Fame project on Friday, 18 May 2001, with a BBQ breakfast at 7am on Coogee Beach.
